

Research Brief: 2019-2020 SCFF Data Validation Summary

The following document contains the initial 2019-2020 Student Centered Funding Formula (SCFF) supplemental and student success counts for Mt. San Antonio College (Mt. SAC). The counts represent the number of enrolled students who met specific outcomes during the 2019-2020 academic year. The counts were provided by the California Community College Chancellor's Office (CCCCO) on January 13, 2021 based on Management Information System (MIS) data provided by the college.

As part of its regular duties, the Information Technology (IT) department submits MIS data to the CCCCCO four to six different times during the academic year. Prior to each submission, IT provides relevant constituents around campus access to their preliminary data in order to validate IT's collection process. As part of its regular duties, the Apportionment Workgroup meets to discuss and further validate relevant submissions. Finally, after the CCCCCO provides the initial student counts, the Office of Research and Institutional Effectiveness attempts to recreate them in order to provide an additional level of validation.

The tables below contain the counts for each of the different Supplemental and Success metrics, as well as the counts for students who previously earned a Pell and/or Promise grant during their educational career. An important note: since the CCCCCO has access to data from all colleges in the system, the numbers they provide Mt. SAC tend to be slightly higher than what can be identified using our internal data. Therefore, if the counts of Mt. SAC's internal MIS data match or are slightly below the counts provided by the state, then the college would not be required to resubmit its data.
