Connection to CCW and LA SIM regional projects

During Round 2.1 & 2.2 in May, 2019, the CE Dean's held a CCW strategic planning retreat to help reverse enrollment declines. A major driver of declines was the consumer preferences relating to the actual educational "product", including course content and delivery. They decided to increase their support of LA19 faculty to take on this challenge.

WHAT

The Steering Committee started a "collective accountability network" for strategically planning a CCLA19 Academic Resource Innovation Hub. The Hub will provide faculty from all 19 colleges with the opportunity to collaborate and share best practices and innovations for curriculum. It is a space for GE/CE cross-college/cross-discipline collaboration, faculty professional development, alignment with industry with accelerating roll-out of regional "at- scale projects like Amazon Web Services (AWS), and regional acceleration of successful local CE initiatives.
