

The Economic Challenge


National Gross Domestic Product (GDP) is estimated to be 4.2% lower in 4th Quarter 2020 than in 2019

Value Added to the Economy




In FY 2018–19, Mt. SAC added \$1.3 billion in income to the Mt. SAC District economy, a value 2.3% of the gross regional product.


Job Creation

Mt. SAC's impact supported 15,018 jobs. That is one out of every 33 jobs in the Mt. SAC District




