**RE:** Community Economic Resilience Fund Program Information

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This memo provides information on a potential funding opportunity. Districts may wish to monitor program development to provide feedback and consider further participation.

### **Community Economic Resilience Fund (CERF)**

The CERF program is developed by the Governor's Office of Planning and Research (OPR), Governor's Office Business and Economic Development (GO-Biz), and the California Labor Workforce Development Agency (LWDA) to support resilient, equitable, and sustainable regional economies.

Community colleges that are interested in leading these efforts have the opportunity to provide feedback on the released Planning Phase Draft Guidelines through [CERF Public Workshops](#) during April and May 2022. Please see the Finalized [CERF Regions Map and FAQs](#) to identify your region. CERF staff received 31 letters from over 140 organizations and public agencies during Round 1. Common themes included: inclusive processes and engagement, subregional dynamics and considerations, data and analysis, planning phase requirements and metrics, application considerations, state guidance and resources, and other general comments.

The following information is provided as a summary of the key points within the program and legislation.

### **Funding**

The program was initially funded under the American Rescue Plan Act Coronavirus State & Local Fiscal Recovery Fund of 2021 until the 2022 budget revised the source of funds to the State General Fund in SB 115 (2022).

### **Program Goals**

To build an equitable and sustainable economy across California's diverse regions and foster long-term economic resilience in the overall transition to a carbon-neutral economy.

### **Program Vision**

Deliver a sustainable and equitable economic future that meets communities and regions where they are by supporting new regional plans and investing in strategies and projects that help diversify regional economies and develop or expand environmentally sustainable industries that create high-quality, broadly accessible jobs for all Californians.

### **Development of CERF Regions**

## Community Economic Resilience Fund Program

The OPR, GO-Biz, and LWDA together form the CERF Leadership Team and will facilitate the development of the CERF. The CERF Leadership team is tasked with creating program guidelines, evaluation metrics, conducting oversight and decision making related to the creation and management of the program and competitive grant structures.

The CERF Leadership Team is responsible for the development of geographic regions and boundaries that can administer the program's funding and work.

Thirteen geographical regions will all receive planning grants and implementation funds through a competitive process.
