



Statement from the CCCAA

The following document has been created in accordance with the California Community College Athletics Association (CCCAA), the California Community College Athletic Trainer's Association (CCCATA), the National Collegiate Athletic Association (NCAA), and the CCCAA COVID-19 Working Group in order to create transparency between member college competition within the CCCAA. Amid the ever-changing circumstances surrounding the COVID-19 pandemic, colleges and athletic departments continue to balance competition opportunities and the safety and wellbeing of student-athletes, fans, and support staff. The intent of this document is to assist CCCAA institutions in ensuring that competition between member colleges meets or exceeds state guidelines for safe intercollegiate athletic competition.

Covid-19 Attestation

The college president, an athletic administrator and an athletic trainer must sign and complete this document and submit to the CCCAA and their conference commissioner prior to the first competition.

By signing and dating this form, you attest that at minimum your institution will satisfy the policy requirements outlined below and that you will accept visiting teams coming on your campus and/or you will travel to compete at another campus, even if the opposing school has a lower standard than your campus for the 2021-2022 seasons of sport:

1. All participants within the athletic department (student-athletes, coaches, staff and others) will comply with the CCCAA guidance adopted from the NCAA for safe participation, including but not limited to either a full vaccination mandate and/or 100% weekly testing of the unvaccinated.
2. All participants within the athletic department will appropriately apply a face covering indoors and while not on the playing surface outdoors.
3. In the event a member in item 1 has been identified as being in close contact to another individual who has tested positive in the past 14 days, becomes symptomatic or has a positive test for COVID-19 in the **48 hours** after a contest, the Athletic Director and the Athletic Trainer will contact the opponent(s) and Conference Commissioner(s) as soon as reasonably able and the **same day** they are notified.

Should a college refuse to host a visiting college because they have a stricter standard than the CCCAA guidelines, the following options shall apply:

1. Agree to travel to the visiting team's home site to play the game (mutual consent between athletic directors regarding date/time), inclusive of game management expenses; or
2. Forfeit the game.

State, county/local guidelines shall always take precedence and may supersede CCCAA or institutional thresholds/decisions.
