

AB 30 Update

President's Cabinet Report – November 9, 2021

AB 30 extends AB 288 Career and College Access Pathways (CCAP) agreements past the initial 2021 sunset.

AB 30 streamlines CCAP agreements for school districts and the college by allowing:

A. One reading at the Board of Trustees

Recommendation for one Board reading has been implemented through Dual Enrollment.

- B. Colleges to partner with continuation high schools for possible Dual Enrollment programs
 - Recommendation to partner with continuation high schools has been implemented and is a continuous process through Dual Enrollment.
- C. Students can take up to 4 CCAP community college courses per term, not to exceed 15 units.

Recommendation for students to take 4 courses per term, not to exceed 15 units is currently under review. Dual Enrollment has had some challenges in implementing the recommendations to current Mt. SAC AP 5011 Admission and Concurrent Enrollment of High School and Other Young Students.

D. Credits earned in DE to count towards registration date.

Recommendation to count credits earned towards registration date is currently under review. Dual Enrollment has had some challenges in implementing the recommendation to current Mt. SAC AP 5011 Admission and Concurrent Enrollment of High School and Other Young Students.

E. One standard application for dual enrollment (DE) students under CCAP partnership to complete.

Recommendation for one application has begun implementation with collaboration with Mt. SAC IT Department

- Online application with single sign on for dual enrollment students, pilot implementation began for winter 2022.
- For 2022-23 academic year, one dual enrollment application for CCAP students per academic year.
- One CCCApply: Prototype for one application per academic year.
