# Grants Quarterly Update July 19, 2022

Mt. SAC <u>submitted the following new grant applications</u> in the last quarter of FY 2021-22:

- 1. Foundation for California Community Colleges Nursing Education Investment Grants
  - This grant application was submitted and awarded during the fourth quarter.
  - The project lead is Dr. Susie Chen, Department Co-Chair and Professor of Nursing.
  - The award is \$195,764 over a 22-month period starting 9/1/2022.
  - This project will implement a DEI-focused faculty development program for the
    nursing department, including the creation of a department-level DEI committee to
    continuously monitor and assess the department's effectiveness at closing equity
    gaps. This will include faculty self-assessment, intensive training, implementation of
    pedagogical strategies to improve equity outcomes, tracking the impact of these
    strategies, and sharing among a faculty community of practice.
- 2. California Community Colleges Chancellor's Office LGBTQ+ One-time Funding
  - This grant allocation was awarded and the application was submitting during the fourth quarter.
  - The project lead is Dr. Karelyn Hoover, Dean of Humanities & Social Sciences.
  - The award is \$214,781 over up to a five-year period starting 7/1/2022.
  - This project will support LGBTQ+ students with a focus on sustainability. The primary components will include: a faculty community of practice to improve LGBTQ+ student engagement and academic achievement, a faculty-to-student mentorship program for LGBTQ+ students, and the development/enhancement of LGBTQ+ curriculum. Additionally, the project will develop a needs assessment survey to help identify achievement gaps among LGBTQ+ students, a Lavender Graduation ceremony, LGBTQ+ student engagement activities, including student ambassadors, and improving the physical space of the Pride Center.
- 3. Social Science Research Council Sloan Scholars Mentoring Network Seed Grant
  - This grant application was submitted and awarded during the fourth quarter.
  - The project lead is Dr. Maura Palacios Mejia, Professor of Biology.
  - The award is \$10,000 over a one-year project period starting 8/10/2022.
  - This project will engage students in undergraduate research to explore how plant-microbe symbioses are tightly intertwined in the Mt. SAC Wildlife Sanctuary. Under the direction of the Mt. SAC Wildlife Sanctuary co-directors, students will collect and process eDNA soil samples to quantify shifts in microbial communities in the presence of invasive and native plant species at multiple sites before and after restoration efforts. This study will compare microbial communities under each ecological state to identify both negative and positive plant-microbe interactions that contribute to the establishment or lack thereof for invasive and California native species. Students will engage in data analysis and scientific report writing.

Mt. SAC submitted the following new grant applications in the last quarter of FY 2021-22:

- 4. California Community Foundation Los Angeles Scholars Investment Fund
  - San Gabriel Valley Conservation Corps is the lead applicant. Mt. SAC is a partner.
  - The request for Mt. SAC is \$20,000 over a three-year period.
  - If awarded, this project would launch a Climate Equity Scholars Program among disadvantaged youth in Los Angeles County that would include paid internships on urban greening projects across the San Gabriel Valley. The project would emphasize postsecondary education readiness through case management and mentorship, encouraging interns to enroll in community college upon high school completion.
     Mt. SAC would assist incoming scholars with referrals to support services and programs on campus, facilitate workshops, host a welcome event for incoming scholars, and regularly communicate with the San Gabriel Valley Conservation Corps.
- 5. National Endowment for the Humanities Humanities Initiatives at Hispanic-Serving Institutions
  - The proposed project lead is Hong Guo, Online Learning Librarian.
  - The request is \$129,537 over a 30-month period.
  - If awarded, this project would create a digital photo collection of Mt. SAC's history, including digitizing 5,000 photos and cataloguing 2,500 photos to ensure that they are preserved for future generations. Through accessible and organized primary sources of the college's history and heritage, the collection would support student research and community engagement. It would also support faculty instructional needs through the availability of the collection for use in lessons, assignments, and projects in a variety of disciplines.
- 6. U.S. Department of Education Undergraduate International Students and Foreign Language Program
  - The proposed project lead is Keiko Tsurumi, Professor of Japanese.
  - The request is \$200,000 over a two-year period.
  - If awarded, this project would accomplish the following goals: establish a sister college association with Nagasaki Junior College to develop interdisciplinary academic exchange programs; expand Japanese exchange activities with J. F. Oberlin University to the mutual benefit of American and Japanese students; establish a study abroad program in Japan, with the first program offered in the fall of 2024; host Japanese students at Mt. SAC through a two-week spring program, including classroom visitations and social and cultural activities; and implement interdisciplinary outreach that encourages students to pursue Japanese language studies to enhance their career outlook in their desired field.

Mt. SAC submitted the following new grant applications in the last quarter of FY 2021-22:

- 7. U.S. Department of Labor Strengthening Community Colleges Training Grants
  - Mt. SAC is the lead applicant for the proposed "San Gabriel Valley Health Careers Consortium," which also includes Citrus College, Glendale Community College, Pasadena City College, Rio Hondo College, and University of La Verne. In addition, the project involves employers and the public workforce development system.
  - The request is \$5,000,000 over a four-year period.
  - If awarded, this project would launch a multi-faceted outreach plan to inform and guide underrepresented students into health programs of study that match their interests, aptitude, skill sets, and long-term career goals; implement an onboarding process for students entering health programs of study that identifies needs and barriers to completion and provides wraparound support based on identified needs; launch a community college advocacy and employer engagement campaign to ensure sufficient clinical placements for students and to create a pipeline of diverse, well-prepared graduates for long-term job placements; improve the economic mobility of underrepresented students by accelerating students along health career pathways from entry-level certificates to baccalaureate degrees, and into jobs related to their field of study; and develop a regional data tracking system and data sharing plan that disaggregates student data among the consortium's health programs of study and tracks employment outcomes for program graduates.
- 8. U.S. Department of Education Asian American and Native American Pacific Islander-Serving Institutions, Part A, Cooperative Arrangement
  - Mt. SAC is the lead applicant for the proposed collaborative project, which includes California State Polytechnic University, Pomona.
  - The request is \$2,500,000 over a five-year period.
  - If awarded, this project would address the unique needs of Asian Pacific Islander Desi American (APIDA) students through the implementation of a variety of strategies within the main project components of academic development, transfer collaboration, holistic support, and community engagement. Some of these strategies would include: curriculum development in APIDA Studies themes, faculty exchanges, Transfer Achievement Program Summer Academy for APIDA students, targeted transfer outreach, development of a data sharing plan between Mt. SAC and Cal Poly Pomona to track transfer student outcomes and propose interventions, mental health education and improved access to resources, basic needs support, professional development on culturally relevant instructional strategies and culturally sensitive service delivery, cross-cultural collaboration on intersecting topics, and engagement of APIDA communities through outreach events.

Mt. SAC submitted the following new grant applications in the last quarter of FY 2021-22:

- 9. California Department of Education Child Development Training Consortium
  - This grant allocation was awarded and the application was submitting during the fourth quarter.
  - The project lead is Lucie Melendez, Professor of Child Development.
  - The award is \$13,800 over a ten-month project period starting 9/1/2022.
  - This long-standing project, which is renewed annually, addresses critical shortages in the number of licensed childcare center workers in California. Students enrolled in courses required by the California Commission on Teacher Credentialing to obtain a new or renew a currently held Child Development Permit are eligible to receive direct student aid for successfully completing these courses.
- 10. U.S. Department of Education Congressionally Directed Awards
  - This federal appropriation was allocated earlier in the fiscal year, and the formal application was submitting during the fourth quarter.
  - The project lead is Dr. Tami Pearson, Dean of Continuing Education & Workforce Development.
  - The award is \$500,000 over an 18-month project period starting 9/1/2022.
  - This project will develop a noncredit health careers pre-apprenticeship and Registered Apprenticeship Programs (RAP), particularly targeted at disproportionately impacted adults. The project will develop online curriculum in short-term vocational training in specified health careers, develop a competencybased format for Pharmacy Technician, recruit additional business/industry and workforce agency partners with whom to collaborate and develop apprenticeships, develop at least one RAP and create plans for further RAPs, recruit and enroll students in short-term vocational training and pre-apprenticeships, and develop work-based learning opportunities for short-term health careers programs.
- 11. California Community Colleges Chancellor's Office Nursing Education Program Support
  - This project application was submitted and funded during the fourth quarter.
  - The project lead is Dr. Susie Chen, Department Co-Chair and Professor of Nursing.
  - The award is \$262,448 over a one-year period starting 7/1/2022.
  - The project will: maintain prior additional enrollments in the nursing program; provide a program whereby students demonstrate readiness through diagnostic assessment or successful completion of remedial pre-nursing coursework prior to commencing the nursing program; provide a retention program for students enrolled in the nursing program; provide support services, review courses or software, and practice to assist graduating students to prepare for the licensure exam; and provide faculty opportunities for professional development.

Several <u>new grant projects started</u> in the last quarter of FY 2021-22:

- 1. California Community Colleges Chancellor's Office Invention and Inclusive Innovation (i3) Initiative
  - The project lead is Carolyn Robinson, Professor of Engineering.
  - The grant award is \$125,000 over a 15-month period starting 4/1/2022.
  - This project will engage multi-disciplinary faculty from Engineering, English, Business, and Industrial Design Engineering in the creation of student experiential learning opportunities that encourage invention, innovation, and entrepreneurial mindset skills. The faculty team will participate in funder-sponsored technical assistance, which will lead to the planning, design, and delivery of pilot offerings. These offerings will engage students in product design and development from business and engineering perspectives, and students will enhance their writing, presentation, and pitching skills.
- 2. California Department of Health Care Services Behavioral Health Mentored Internship Program
  - Social Model Recovery Systems is the fiscal agent. Mt. SAC is a sub-recipient.
  - The Mt. SAC project lead is Garett Staley, Professor of Alcohol & Drug Counseling.
  - The grant award for Mt. SAC is \$9,000 over an 18-month period starting 6/1/2022.
  - This project will offer a paid mentored internship program for Mt. SAC students enrolled in the Addictions Counseling program with the River Community residential facility in Azusa and the River Community outpatient facility in Covina. Mt. SAC will conduct outreach, identification, and referral of students to the internship program. Students selected to participate in the internship program will receive a stipend directly from Social Model Recovery Systems.
- 3. California Department of Healthcare Access & Information Health Careers Exploration Program
  - The project lead is Dr. Carmen Rexach, Professor of Biology.
  - The grant award is \$12,000 over a one-year period starting 6/30/2022.
  - This project will offset the cost of Mt. SAC's Health Professions Conference, which
    targets high school and college students who are exploring educational and
    professional options in the health careers. The conference will include activities such
    as a keynote speaker, concurrent sessions, panel presentations from industry
    experts, a health fair, interactive sessions to teach students new skills, and
    networking opportunities, among other career exploration activities.

- 4. California Department of Healthcare Access & Information Song-Brown Health Care Workforce Training Program, Registered Nurse Education Programs
  - The project lead is Dr. Susie Chen, Department Co-Chair and Professor of Nursing.
  - The grant award is \$320,000 over a 26-month period starting 6/30/2022.
  - This project will implement the following activities: hire tutors and clinical teaching assistants to positively impact student retention; promote student success through expanded presentations, workshops, cultural presentations, and "back-to-school" events; evaluate student readiness and proficiency and implement strategies to improve student performance in critical areas; hire lab assistants for the skills, remedial, and simulation labs; purchase audiovisual equipment and instructional supplies to ensure that students have access to current materials; upgrade human patient simulators and software to enhance student clinical reasoning, critical thinking, and application of the nursing process; and advance additional ADN-BSN collaboration in nursing education.
