Mt. SAC submitted the following new grant applications in the first quarter of FY 2022-23:

- 1. Los Angeles County through Amity Foundation Care First Community Investment Funding
 - The proposed project lead is Joe Louis Hernandez, Director of Rising Scholars.
 - The request is \$1,500,000 over a three-year period.
 - If awarded, this project would serve systems-impacted students participating in the
 Rising Scholars program. Grant funding would enhance the program's recruitment,
 matriculation, and retention through the following activities: collaboration with
 government agencies and nonprofit partners in recruiting students and developing
 clear pathways to higher education; assisting participants with college and financial
 aid applications, educational planning, and onboarding activities; wraparound
 support from staff, counselors, social workers, and/or peer mentors; and workshops,
 events, and cultural activities to further create a community of learners.
- 2. California Department of Developmental Services Employment Grants for Adults with Disabilities
 - The proposed project lead is Sage Overoye, Director of Education for Older Adults and Adults with Disabilities Program.
 - The request is \$423,607 over an 18-month period.
 - If awarded, this project would provide work readiness training, transportation
 coaching, and preparation for on-the-job training, paid internships, and employment
 for adults with intellectual and developmental disabilities. This would include
 engaging employers in establishing internships for participants, expanding existing
 course offerings to promote independent living and employment skills, creating a
 program for job and transportation coaching for participants, and developing
 sustainable relationships with employers that lead to long-term employment
 opportunities for adults with disabilities.
- 3. Michelson 20MM Foundation Student Basic Needs Spark Grant
 - The proposed project lead is Dr. Julie Marquez, Director of EOPS/CARE.
 - The request is \$25,000 over a one-year project period.
 - If awarded, this project would address the challenge of maximizing basic needs resources in serving parenting students in need, including cross-campus collaboration to maximize resources. The project would evaluate and document best practices for delivering basic needs resources to parenting students. These efforts would lead to the development of an open-source Parent Academy manual that will document best practices and effective processes and procedures in coordinating basic needs resources for parenting students at college campuses across California.

Mt. SAC submitted the following new grant applications in the first quarter of FY 2022-23:

- 4. U.S. Department of Education Basic Needs for Postsecondary Students
 - The proposed project lead is Rigo Estrada, Director of Basic Needs Resources.
 - The request for is \$813,552 over a three-year period.
 - If awarded, this project would be a collaboration between the college's Basic Needs Resources and Rising Scholars programs. In addition to providing basic needs resources and wraparound support to formerly incarcerated students, the project would enable the college to address the significant barriers to finding affordable and accessible housing for formerly incarcerated students. The college would coordinate with community partners to provide housing placement services for participants, including a monthly housing stipends for a cohort of qualified students who maintain eligibility requirements. Additional support services would aim to improve participants' persistence and educational goal completion.
- 5. National Aeronautics and Space Administration University Leadership Initiative
 - California State University, Long Beach, is the lead applicant.
 - Mt. SAC is a partner, along with San Jose State University, Collins Aerospace, and Sato Academy of Math and Science.
 - This submission was a preliminary proposal with no specific budget request. If invited to submit a full proposal, the estimated request for all partners combined is \$3 million over a three-year period.
 - If awarded, this project would address the challenges for the successful integration
 of urban air mobility (UAM), which is the system of air passenger and small cargo
 transportation within an urban area, into the existing transportation network. This
 project would include research, development, validation, and application of
 technology, guidelines, and standards in UAM operations and integration. Mt. SAC
 faculty would develop curriculum and training in support of concept of operation
 and technologies, including aeronautical knowledge, safety risk management, and
 flight proficiency for commercial pilot certification standards of UAM aircraft.

Several new grant projects started in the first quarter of FY 2022-23:

- 1. The Arthur N. Rupe Foundation awarded a \$15,000 grant through the Certified Nursing Assistant Program. This one-year project will increase the college's capacity to meet the workforce and student demand for the CNA program by providing tutoring, counseling, expanded lab hours, certification exam preparation, scholarships to low-income students to cover the cost of participation in the program, and CNA certification exam fees.
- 2. The Nursing Department has received two separate grants.
 - The Chancellor's Office awarded a \$262,448 grant through the Nursing Education Program Support initiative. This one-year project will maintain prior additional enrollments in the nursing program; provide a program whereby students demonstrate readiness through diagnostic assessment or successful completion of remedial pre-nursing coursework prior to commencing the nursing program; provide a retention program for students enrolled in the nursing program; provide support services, review courses or software, and practice to assist graduating students to prepare for the licensure exam; and provide faculty professional development.
 - The Foundation for California Community Colleges awarded a \$195,764 grant through the Nursing Education Investment Grants Program. This two-year project will implement a DEI-focused faculty development program for the nursing department, including the creation of a department-level DEI committee to continuously monitor and assess the department's effectiveness at closing equity gaps. This will include faculty self-assessment, intensive training, implementation of pedagogical strategies to improve equity outcomes, tracking the impact of these strategies, and sharing among a faculty community of practice.
- 3. The Chancellor's Office awarded a \$214,871 allocation through the LGBTQ+ Support Program. This project's primary components include: a faculty community of practice to improve LGBTQ+ student engagement and academic achievement, a faculty-to-student mentorship program for LGBTQ+ students, the development/enhancement of LGBTQ+ curriculum, the development of a needs assessment survey to help identify achievement gaps among LGBTQ+ students, a Lavender Graduation ceremony, LGBTQ+ student engagement activities, and improvement of the physical space of the Pride Center.
- 4. The California Department of Education, passed through Yosemite Community College District, awarded a \$13,800 grant though the Child Development Training Consortium. This one-year project will address critical shortages in the number of licensed childcare center workers in California. Students enrolled in courses required by the California Commission on Teacher Credentialing to obtain a new or renew a currently held Child Development Permit are eligible to receive direct student aid for successfully completing these courses.

Several new grant projects started in the first quarter of FY 2022-23:

- 5. The Rising Scholars Program has received two separate grants.
 - The Los Angeles County Department of Health Services awarded a \$250,000 grant through the College and Career Program. This one-year project will conduct outreach to probation offices and reentry contractors, administer intake assessment and educational planning for participants, provide workshops to help prepare students for the college experience, coordinate guest speakers and cultural activities, conduct college tours, provide a summer bridge experience, assist with financial aid applications, provide expungement clinics, assist participants in securing employment opportunities, and offer individualized support services.
 - The Chancellor's Office awarded a \$462,000 grant through the Rising Scholars Network. This three-year project will expand the number of justice-involved students participating and succeeding in community college. The project aims to increase the number of students completing certificates, degrees, and/or credentials, increasing the number of students transferring to four-year institutions, decreasing the average number of units accumulated by students earning associate degrees, and reducing equity gaps among justice-involved students.
- 6. The U.S. Department of Education awarded a \$500,000 grant through the Congressionally Directed Awards process. This three-year project will develop a noncredit health careers pre-apprenticeship and Registered Apprenticeship Programs (RAP). The project will develop online curriculum in short-term vocational training in specified health careers, develop a competency-based format for Pharmacy Technician, recruit additional business/industry and workforce agency partners with whom to collaborate and develop apprenticeships, develop at least one RAP and create plans for further RAPs, recruit and enroll students in short-term vocational training and pre-apprenticeships, and develop work-based learning opportunities for short-term health careers programs.
- 7. The U.S. Department of Education awarded a \$1,687,390 grant through the Upward Bound Program. This five-year project, which is a continuation grant, will provide low-income and potential first-generation college students at La Puente and Ganesha High Schools with academic enrichment, personal development, student support, and college preparation activities that will enable them to stay in school, graduate from high school, and successfully enter and graduate from postsecondary education.
