- 1. Cabinet reviewed and commented on the following standing items:
 - a. Marketing and Public Affairs provided the following updates to Cabinet:
 - Loma Media interviewed about 20 campus members, including Trustees Robert Hidalgo and Manuel Baca, regarding the Mascot change. The next Mascot Committee meeting is scheduled for November 13th, and they will send a survey to the campus at the end of the month.
 - The American Green Zone Alliance Certification Ceremony was well attended by the campus community, constituent groups, and Trustees Gary Chow, Manuel Baca, and Peter Hidalgo.
 - The Campaign for College Opportunity Campaign recognized Mt. SAC as one of the 2023 Champions of Higher Education Excellence in Transfer. The announcement will be shared this week.
