- 1. Cabinet reviewed and commented on the following standing items:
  - a. Marketing and Public Affairs provided the following updates:
    - Public Affairs is working on articles for the Mt. SAC magazine and will include an article on the first annual Women of Color Action Network (WOCAN) Conference. Jill will be interviewing those involved in the inaugural planning.
    - Urel Martinez, the Alumnus of the Year, will be featured on the #bestdecisionever campaign this week.
