Project Description What need will the project address? What activities will be implemented?	The College has received Song-Brown funding for the Nursing program for many years. This competitive grant program is based on Mt. SAC's enrollments, partnerships with clinical sites located in Registered Nurse Shortage Areas (RNSAs), and graduates who go on to work in RNSAs. Grant funding supports equipment, supplies, textbooks, software, clinical teaching assistants, tutors, and other supports that enhance the program to improve student outcomes.
Expected Outcomes What are the project's expected benefits/outcomes?	Grant funding enables the Nursing program to provide equipment, supplies, and support services that directly benefit students. Outcomes include reduction of costs for students, improved retention and course success rates in the program, increased graduation rates, and increased numbers of students passing the certification exam and practicing in RNSAs throughout the region.

Sustainability Plan What is the plan for continuing grant activities beyond the project period?	The funder does not require a sustainability plan. This is an annual competitive state grant, and the Nursing program plans to apply every year. We have been careful to not include permanent salaries or other ongoing costs. If future grant funding was not available, the program would scale back on providing tutoring, textbooks packages for students, new equipment, and other non-mandatory activities.
