An act to ~~amend, repeal,~~ *repeal* and add Section 7597.1 of the Government Code, relating to public postsecondary education.

LEGISLATIVE COUNSEL'S DIGEST

AB 1594, as amended, McCarty. Public postsecondary education: prohibition of using tobacco and smoking on campuses.

(1) Existing law establishes the University of California, under the administration of the Regents of the University of California; the California State University, under the administration of the Trustees of the California State University; and the California Community Colleges, under the administration of the Board of Governors of the California Community Colleges, as the segments of public postsecondary education in this state.

Existing law prohibits public employees or members of the public from smoking any tobacco product inside a public building or in a nearby outdoor area, as specified. Existing law also provides that the governing bodies of the California State University and each community college district have the authority to set enforcement standards relating to smoking on their campuses and to enforce these requirements by citation and fine, as specified. Existing law also authorizes the Trustees of the California State University to establish rules and regulations for

the government and maintenance of the buildings and grounds of the university, and provides that a violation or attempted violation of these rules and regulations is a misdemeanor.

This bill ~~would~~ *would, beginning January 1, 2018,* prohibit smoking and the use of a tobacco product, including, but not limited to, an e-cigarette, on a campus of the California State University or the California Community Colleges. The bill would authorize the governing bodies of the California State University and each community college district to set standards for the enforcement of that prohibition. *The bill would authorize the campuses to conduct a positive educational campaign to increase the awareness of a tobacco- and smoke-free policy.* The bill would authorize the enforcement of this prohibition by a fine, not to exceed \$100, as specified. The bill would require the proceeds of the fine to be ~~allocated, upon appropriation,~~ *allocated* for purposes including support of the educational operations of the campus on which the violation occurs, education about and promotion of the policy implemented by the bill, and tobacco use cessation treatment options for students of that campus.

To the extent that these provisions would impose new duties on community college districts, and extend the scope of activities on the buildings and grounds of the California State University that could be charged as misdemeanors, they would constitute a state-mandated local program.

This bill would encourage the Regents of the University of California to adopt and enforce new, or continue to enforce existing, policies substantially similar to those described above.

~~This bill would make these provisions operative on January 1, 2018.~~

(2) The California Constitution requires the state to reimburse local agencies and school districts for certain costs mandated by the state. Statutory provisions establish procedures for making that reimbursement.

This bill would provide that with regard to certain mandates no reimbursement is required by this act for a specified reason.

With regard to any other mandates, this bill would provide that, if the Commission on State Mandates determines that the bill contains costs so mandated by the state, reimbursement for those costs shall be made pursuant to the statutory provisions noted above.

32 (3) (A) *Following a positive educational campaign and after*

1 (B) *The proceeds of the fines imposed under this paragraph*
2 *shall be allocated, upon appropriation, allocated for purposes to*
3 *include, but not necessarily be limited to, support of the educational*
4 *operations of the campus on which the violation occurs, education*
5 *about and promotion of the policy implemented by this section,*
6 *and tobacco use cessation treatment options for students of that*

17 *effect.*

18 (E) *No fine shall be imposed under this paragraph unless and*
19 *until an educational campaign conducted pursuant to paragraph*
20 *(2) fails to result in substantial compliance with the prohibition*
21 *set forth in subdivision (a).*

22 (c) The Regents of the University of California are encouraged
23 to adopt and enforce new, or continue to enforce existing, policies
24 substantially similar to subdivisions (a) and (b).

25 (d) For purposes of this section, the following definitions apply:

26 (1) To “smoke” means either of the following:

27 (A) To inhale, exhale, burn, or carry any lit or heated substance,
28 including, but not limited to, a tobacco product: cigar, cigarette,
29 pipe, or any other product intended for the inhalation of tobacco
30 or another plant product, whether natural or synthetic, in any
31 manner or in any form.

32 (B) To operate an electronic smoking instrument: device that
33 creates an aerosol or vapor in any manner or in any form, or any
34 other oral device for the purpose of circumventing a prohibition
35 against smoking.

36 (2) “Use a tobacco product” means inhaling, smoking, chewing,
37 dipping, or any other assimilation into the body of tobacco.

38 (3) “Tobacco product” means all forms of tobacco, including
39 smokeless tobacco, cigarettes, cigars, pipes, hookahs, and
40 e-cigarettes.

1 (e) ~~This section shall become operative on January 1, 2018. The~~
2 *governing bodies of the California State University or a community*
3 *college district may continue and enforce a tobacco use policy*
4 *adopted before January 1, 2017, until the prohibition set forth in*
5 *subdivision (a) takes effect.*

6 SEC. 3. No reimbursement is required by this act pursuant to
7 Section 6 of Article XIII B of the California Constitution for certain
8 costs that may be incurred by a local agency or school district
9 because, in that regard, this act creates a new crime or infraction,
10 eliminates a crime or infraction, or changes the penalty for a crime
11 or infraction, within the meaning of Section 17556 of the
12 Government Code, or changes the definition of a crime within the
13 meaning of Section 6 of Article XIII B of the California
14 Constitution.

15 However, if the Commission on State Mandates determines that
16 this act contains other costs mandated by the state, reimbursement
17 to local agencies and school districts for those costs shall be made
18 pursuant to Part 7 (commencing with Section 17500) of Division
19 4 of Title 2 of the Government Code.
