

Initial Pilot Colleges: A Brief Summary

Background:

In late Spring 2014, the Chancellor's Office called for interested colleges to participate in the initial pilot group in the **Online Education Initiative** as a *Teaching College* (teach students from the other CCC), *Home College* (allow our students to take online courses at other CCC while retaining residency at our college), or both. Fifty-eight colleges applied, which were too many for an initial pilot. A second round of applications yielded twenty-four colleges of which Mt. SAC was one. The twenty-four colleges were divided into three groups of eight: Full Launch Colleges, Student Readiness Staging Group, and Tutoring Staging Group. Besides group specific activities, all colleges will also participate in other project activities. More information is available at <http://ccconlineed.org/>

All participating colleges will agree to the following:

- Participation in the course review [*for compliance with state and federal regulations, e.g., accessibility*] and update activities. [*Our locally conducted mock accreditation review already did this; however, not all of the courses identified for the OEI participated in that process.*]
- Use of CCCApply application by January 2015. [*We've been using CCCApply for a few years.*]
- Participation in the development of reciprocity agreements that will be needed to implement the project and ensure that all students receive the services necessary for their success.
- Participation in professional development activities as appropriate.
- Obtain the agreement to participate from the local Academic Senate. [*5/27/14, Distance Learning Committee recommended and endorsed our college's participation as Teaching College and Home College. 9/9/14 Curriculum & Instruction Council voted to support the project.*]
- Provide data necessary to assess the effectiveness of the pilot efforts.

Pilot College Selection Criteria

The following considerations were used to determine college inclusion in the pilot:

- Use of Open CCCApply, a system wide online application and identification system for California Community Colleges admission and financial aid (see <http://home.cccapply.org/>)

- Completion of second request for information

- Established online degree programs that could contribute knowledge and best practices based on experience

Established professional development programs that assist faculty members with online education-oriented pedagogical and student services concerns

- Geographical location (north, south, central), and size of student population (small, medium, large)

- Diversity of course management systems (CMS), important for learning about the best practices, features and functions of the different systems to inform the ultimate selection of a common CMS

- Capacity, in terms of faculty and staff, to add more online courses

- Pilot involvement in related CCC projects, the Common Assessment Initiative (CAI) (<http://cccassess.org/>) and Educational Planning Initiative (EPI) (<http://cccedplan.org/>)

Tutoring Staging Group: Mt. SAC, Imperial Valley College, Ohlone, Columbia, LA Pierce, Saddleback, Barstow, and Victor Valley.

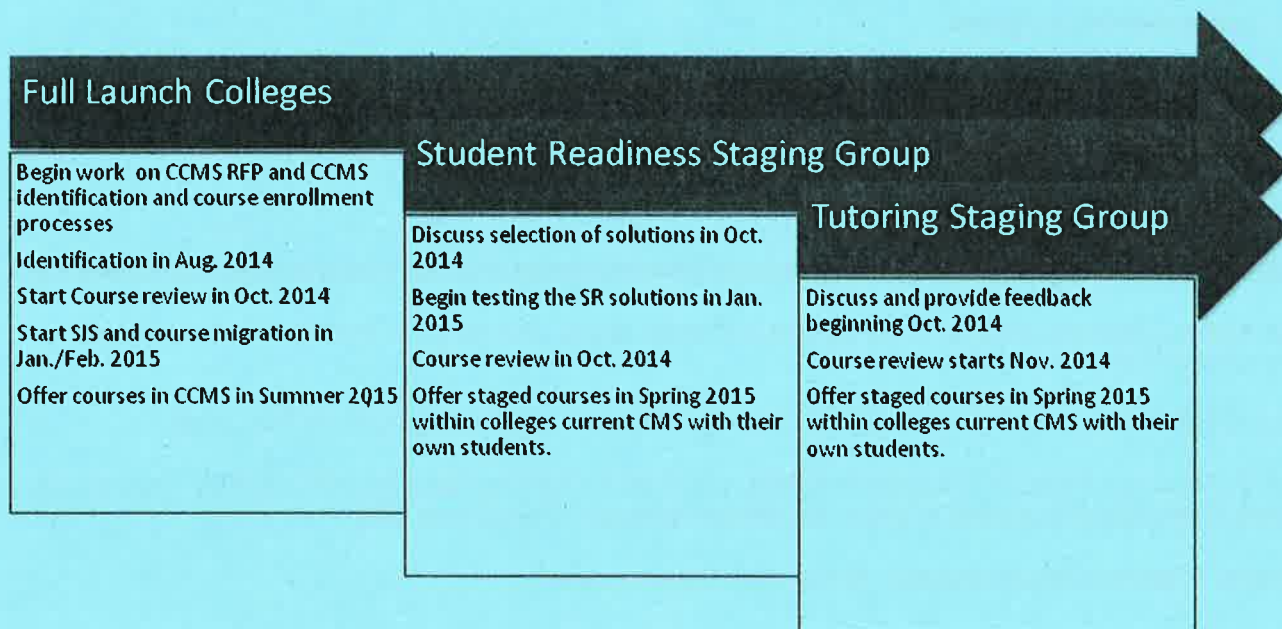
- Review and pilot method of delivering effective online tutoring services for students in online classes and integrating statewide support services with local tutoring services.
- Develop a plan to promote robust and effective use of online tutoring services.
- Participate in evaluation of online tutoring pilot.
- Participate in staging activities for entry into the course exchange.
- Colleges begin tutoring solution preparation work in November 2014 with participating colleges submitting candidate courses to the OEI for inclusion in Spring 2015.
- The tutoring pilot will take place within the teaching colleges' own systems with their own students and CMS.

Full Launch Staging Group: Butte, Coastline, Foothill, Shasta, Fresno City, Lake Tahoe, Mt. San Jacinto and Ventura

Student Readiness Staging Group: Antelope Valley, Cabrillo, College of the Canyons, Monterey Peninsula, West Los Angeles, Rio Hondo, MiraCosta and Hartnell.

OEI's General Timeline:

- August 2014: College Selection
- August 2014: Colleges respond to selection announcement; pilot groups are formed
- August 2014: Work with the Technical Implementation Group begins with participation in the development of the common course management system (CCMS) request for proposal (RFP) phase
- September 2014: Colleges participating in the SRG begin work with the OEI Chief Student Services Officer
- September 2014: Colleges participating in the OTG begin work with the OEI Chief Academic Affairs Officer (Jory Hadsell)

Questions & Some Answers [from the 9/10/14 kick-off phone conference with Jory Hadsell]

1. When would Mt. SAC begin offering courses via OEI?

It depends on the CMS decision and implementation. The soonest is Summer 2015. By Fall 2015, identify the number of courses to be in OEI. Fully in effect in Spring 2016.

2. Who gets FTES – Home College or Teaching College?

Teaching College gets the FTES generated. Home College gets to claim completion for the Score Card. Actual timeline and how it works depend on when the Course Exchange is up and running. There are reciprocity agreements that need to be developed among participating colleges; it is a complex project and will likely take a while to establish.

3. CMS determination – who's deciding and who's in the room to make those decisions?

The CMS Steering Committee and representatives from the Full Launch 8 colleges make up the group that is developing the criteria for RFP. The group now has 50 people with diverse and broad representation across the state's CC. One criterion the group says is crucial is whatever CMS is chosen, the course content migration process has to be as easy for faculty as possible.

4. What are the data elements for assessing the effectiveness of the pilot efforts?

This is an ongoing conversation which includes the participating faculty and colleges. Participating colleges will have the opportunity to participate in the evaluation rubric and data elements. Virtual meetings will be held throughout the semester (Spring 2015). In general, the idea is to look for change in retention and success rates in the participating 3-5 course sections compared to other non-OEI courses. OEI is working with the RP Group to design the evaluation.
