





8. Hearing a Grand Performance in DTLA


A curated collection of **seasonal musical performances** in downtown Los Angeles, and totally free!

Transfer Services Interview:

SA - Student Assistant K - Krystle Bybee (Mt. SAC Transfer Specialist)

SA: Thank you for being interviewed for the International News, Krystle. I have prepared some questions to ask you about the Transfer Services at Mt. SAC. I wish to get some useful information for International Student. During Spring semester, I know that most of the universities are not yet opened for students to apply. What should we do to prepare for the transfer application?

K: For international students, who want to transfer to UC (University of California), they need to prepare for their application and personal statement. I strongly encourage them to start working on their personal statement as soon as possible, and we have the personal statement workshop every Fall semester.

SA: Do we have any transfer workshops in this semester that give the students some tips about transferring?

K: Actually, we do not have many workshops during Spring semester, but we do hold a large-scale transfer fair that hosts more than 50 universities coming to Mt. SAC and promoting their schools in April. Moreover, I suggest that students can try to visit university they are interested in. Also, students can connect with other University Representatives. The representatives provide students with useful advice and admission information, and they come to Mt SAC every month. Hence, come to the Transfer Center and make an appointment with the representatives to learn more about your desired transfer institutions.

SA: Finally, I would like to ask you about the out-of-state application. Do you have any advice or tips about that?

K: For out-of-state application, it really depends on the school student is going to apply. There are several systems for out-of-state school. If students are really interested about it, they can make an appointment with us at Transfer Services Center. We also provide walk-in appointments during October and November. Lastly, I strongly recommend students to use the resources that are provided by Transfer Services. We have a list of events that help students with transferring, including various university tours. Come to the Transfer Services Center located in building 9B, and visit us in person or on the web at https://transfer.mtsac.edu.

Transfer Tips for International Students

Get Involved: Join the International Student Club!

Before transferring to another school, remember to meet with your DSO. Bring your acceptance letter from the university you plan to attend along with the completed International Student Request Form.

DID YOU KNOW...

- The transfer release date is when the DSO at your new school takes responsibility for your SEVIS record. Your SE-VIS record must be current for you to maintain legal immigration status in the U.S., so it's crucial you keep open lines of communication with this official.
- To maintain legal immigration status, international students need to continue to attend classes while waiting for their transfer release date. Otherwise, your DSO could terminate your SEVIS record and Student Visa.
- Once you have a transfer release date, be sure to work with the DSO at your new school. They must create a new Form I-20 for you. And, you are required to contact this DSO within 15 days of the program start date on your new Form I-20.

F-1 Student Employment

BULLETIN: F-1 students have an option for one kind of work: on-campus employment. There are limited work opportunities available in the U.S. for F-1 students. For this reason, proof of financial ability is required prior to admission to the college. Off-campus work is not allowed. The U.S. government takes working illegally very seriously. If your DSO knows you are working without authorization, your SEVIS and your record can be terminated.

REMEMBER: There's still time to petition for graduation! Complete the Application for Graduation form by May 15, 2015.



Remember to complete your program of study by the program end date listed on your Form I-20. If you need more time to graduate or complete your program, you must request a later program end date by contacting your <u>Designated School Official (DSO)</u>, who can print an updated Form I-20 for you. Remember, your visa expiration date does not determine your permitted length of stay in the United States.
