About Mt. SAC

Mt. San Antonio College has established a national reputation for educational excellence and distinction. Among the largest of California's 113 community colleges, Mt. SAC serves nearly 60,000 students annually on its 420-acre campus in Walnut, California. The city is regularly named by Money Magazine as one of the 50 Best Places to Live in the country.

Mt. SAC offers students a diverse, community-focused environment with high-quality degree and certificate programs, exceptional faculty, top-notch facilities and state-of-the-art. Students excel, grow and thrive at Mt. SAC – earning state, national and international honors in the areas of athletics, the arts, aviation, health and natural sciences, communication, agriculture and robotics.

Our Historic Roots

Mt. SAC was founded in 1946 on what was once a sprawling 48,000-acre ranch with groves of citrus and walnut trees, packing houses and small farms. The area that is now the college campus was converted into an army hospital and then a Navy hospital during the war.

As World War II came to an end, local leaders anticipated the return of young students to complete their college education, and thus the Mt. San Antonio Community College District was formed.

The college was initially named Eastern Los Angeles County Community College, but was later renamed Mt. San Antonio College after the snow-capped mountain prominently visible in the distance above campus.

Noteworthy Achievements and Recognition

- Mt. SAC is home of the world-famous Mt. SAC Relays, the world's largest track and field competition with more than 14,000 competitors of all ages from across the globe.
- The Athletics program is recognized in overall athletic excellence for student teams at the two-year college level and has earned the National Alliance of Two-Year College Athletic Administrators Cup Championship.
- Our health career students hold national recognition, most recently earning 10 recent gold and silver medals at the Health Occupation Students of America (HOSA) national competition.
- Our Honors Program is the state's largest, offering advanced students an opportunity to take honors sections of transferable general education courses, which strengthens students' college transcripts and increases their chances to transfer to top universities.
- The Forensics Team stands out nationally, recently placing second overall at the 2016 Phi Rho Pi National Tournament, where our students won 24 gold, silver and bronze medals in competitions against 500 other students from 64 colleges.
- The Turf Team 208 is ranked fifth nationally after competing at the 12th annual Sports Turf Management Conference and Exhibition Student Challenge.
- The Jazz Band and Frontline both are considered best in their class after placing 1st at the Reno International Jazz Festival.
- Our award-winning Flying Team continues to soar, having recently won the Top Community College Trophy at the National Intercollegiate Flying Association's National Competition (sixth win since 2000), and the Top Community College Trophy at the Regional Competition (23rd consecutive regional award).
- Industrial Design students stand out with their fully functional, Multi-Platform Flight/Ground Simulation Chair that took first place in the 2014 Regional AERO Def Manufacturing Competition.
- The college's Career Services department partners directly with local employers to find them qualified Mt. SAC student and alumni candidates. Students are offered services to attend career fairs, gain experience through internships, and acquire employment skills through workshops and one-on-one training.
- The Robotics Team continues to shine, winning first in the inaugural event METAL CRUNCH; third in skills points at the VEX University World Competition; and sixth in programming out of a field of 60 international university competitors.

We pride ourselves on the excellence and variety of our 200+ academic programs. Our students participate in prestigious research programs, compete (and often win) nationally, as well as work directly with industry-experienced faculty. The Honors Program is one of the largest in the state, offering vigorous programs, small class sizes and unique university transfer agreements for motivated students.

Student Support

Numerous resources are available to support students academically and personally, from tutoring and counseling to child care and health services. More than 25 support programs have been developed for a broad range of students. Whether they are veterans, former foster youths, single parents or DREAMers, they have a support program designed to ensure success.

Outstanding Facilities

Mt. SAC has invested more than \$500 million to provide quality facilities, current technology and an innovative learning environment for our students thanks to public support of Measures R and RR. Students learn in first-rate and unique facilities, including a cutting-edge technology center, a planetarium and observatory, an agricultural science complex complete with a veterinary hospital, and a state-of-the-art science complex just to name a few.

Unsurpassed Value

Mt. SAC students get the full college experience without the full college debt. With classes costing just \$46 per unit, Mt. SAC offers a high-quality education for about 80 percent less than California State University campuses. About three out of four students receive financial aid. In addition, most of our students pay close to nothing thanks to the California Community College Board of Governors Fee Waiver, which waives the enrollment fee for qualified California students.
