

## Computed Tomography Program Admissions Application

The Computed Tomography (CT) Program is an advanced imaging certificate program. The program has special admission requirements, limited enrollment, and is only open to technologists currently certified and registered by the ARRT in Radiologic Technology, Nuclear Medicine, or Radiation Therapy. Applicants are responsible for ensuring that all admission requirements below are met, and all documents are submitted on time. Only complete application files will be reviewed for admission. Students must follow program curriculum as defined at the time of acceptance to the program. In addition, clinical sites may have additional pre-admission requirements that each student would be responsible for completing prior to clinical placement.

### Application Checklist

- 1. File a Mt. San Antonio College application, be accepted to the college, and be a student in good standing.
- 2. Complete the CT program application (see reverse side)
- 3. Attach a copy of your current ARRT certification/registration
- 4. Attach a copy of your current CA Certified Radiologic Technologist (CRT) license
- 5. Attach a copy (front & back side) of your current CPR card
  - American Heart Association: BLS Healthcare Provider, valid 2 years
- 6. Attach a copy of your CA venipuncture certification or venipuncture training and education completion document (required)
- 7. Attach your Clinical Exemption Documentation **if applicable** (see p. 12 of handbook)
- 8. Send the application with supporting documentation via email to Yen Hang at [yhang@mtsac.edu](mailto:yhang@mtsac.edu). Applications may also be delivered to the Allied Health Programs Office (Bldg. 67A/145, 909- 274-4963).
  - The application window is between Sept 1<sup>st</sup> – Oct 1<sup>st</sup>. The deadline date for application submission is **Oct 1<sup>st</sup>**. Only applications submitted with all required supporting documentation (see 3-7 above) will be considered.

***AFTER a student receives confirmation that he/she has been provisionally admitted into the program, the following admission requirements must be met prior to formal program admission. Instructions on how to complete these requirements and where to submit documentation will be provided with your provisional admission letter.***

1. Complete and submit health physical, required tests, immunizations, and other clinical site requirements if applicable.
2. Submit an acceptable background check: All students will be required to complete a background check prior to program admission. The clinical affiliate determines if a student can participate in the clinical rotation based upon the results of the background check.
3. Attend a mandatory program orientation. The date and time of orientation will be provided to you upon provisional program admission.

*It is strongly recommended that students self-report criminal or disciplinary history prior to program admission or anytime as needed and complete the ARRT's pre-application. This process can help avoid delays or denial in clinical placement, or denial of licensure.*
