Searching for Your Place

- 1) Set a budget and know what you can afford (see budgeting basics on the website).
- 2 Save up your required expenses, including deposits and fees, or tap into resources.
- 3 Create a criteria list. Outline your wants, needs, and deal breakers.
- 4 Start your search online or by driving around in the area you want to live in.
- 5 Visit the rentals, do a walk-through, and take notes.

Roommates & Rooms for Rent

- 1 If you plan to move in with a roommate, you will apply together and both of your information will be considered.
- Having a roommate you trust can be a great way to share costs

- Make sure expectations and requirements are clearly laid out from the beginning
- Most apartment renting sites can filter for "rooms for rent", but don't pay anything until you see the place and have a signed agreement.

Looking At A Unit



Get information to determine if the unit fits your budget and your needs.

- Ask about the average cost of utilities
- Is there a laundry unit?
- Are pets allowed?
- Is there adequate space (living/storage)?
- Is it clean and well maintained?
- Do you see evidence of pests or maintenance problems?
- Is it in a neighborhood you want to live in?
- Is there adequate near by transportation?
- Are there grocery stores near by?
- Does the unit have parking/garage?
- What are the amenities?
