

REAL COLLEGE SURVEY DATA ON BASIC NEEDS AMONG MT. SAC STUDENTS REPORT



SUMMARY

The data for this report is from the larger study from the 2023 Real College Survey administered by the RP Group to all the California community colleges. The data reflects the responses specifically for Mount San Antonio College (Mt. SAC) with a total of 2,061 responses. The raw data was decoded using the College Codebook provided by the RP Group using Access and data analysis was completed in Excel.

Notes to consider while reading the report:

- 1. The racial/ethnic categorization mirrors the same groups reported in the "Affordability, Food, and Housing Access Taskforce Report Real College California: Basic Needs Among California Community College Students" (Real College Report).
- 2. The racial/ethnic category "Other Asian" includes East, South, and other Asian which is mirrors how the groups are aggregated in the Real College Report.
- 3. The total count included in each question varied depending on the focus of the question. The total count is indicated in each question either explicitly or noted with an asterisk.
