STUDENT PROFILES

Adult Basic Education

The Adult Basic Education (ABE) Lab provides a variety of programs and assessments. There are different student profiles based on the purpose for which students utilize services. For example, the average High School Equivalency (GED/HiSET) student is Hispanic/Latino, did not complete high school, and is interested in obtaining a High School Equivalency to pursue an educational, vocational, or personal goal. Conversely, the typical computer literacy student is a female who has at least a high school diploma and is interested in improving skills to return to the workforce.

Adult High School Diploma

The range of student ages in the Adult High School Diploma Program is from 18-64 and the percentage of students between the ages of 18-22, 23-29, and 30-45 is balanced (28%, 33%, and 31%, respectively). The average student is Hispanic female who left high school in her junior or senior year. Students are able to attend class online and/or in-person. Instructors provide support in both modalities simultaneously. The vast majority of students opt to participate entirely online. Students generally take one class at a time and can complete a class in a minimum of 62.5 hours.

Adults with Disabilities

Adults with Disabilities (AWD) students are primarily adults with developmental and intellectual disabilities who have exited K-12 schooling, but are looking to continue their education. They are enrolled in the program to acquire life skills, employment skills, and to participate in the community and college life. The majority of students are between the ages of 23-45 years (58%) and there are about equal numbers of men and women. Students are enrolled in multiple classes each semester. Classes are offered online, on campus, and off campus in partnership with community organizations.

Education for Older Adults

Education for Older Adults (EOA) students are primarily women (74%), retired, and over the age of 65 (79%). These students enter class with different levels of real-world experience as well as a multitude of educational levels, age variances, and life skills. Students focus on skill building and healthy aging, including brain health. Many EOA students prefer to take classes in their home communities, or in their homes. Most courses are offered off campus at local community and senior centers, as well as online to accommodate homebound students and students with limited access to transportation. A typical EOA student enrolls in multiple classes each term and continues to participate in the program throughout the academic year (71%).

English as a Second Language (ESL)

The English as a Second Language (ESL) program helps adult immigrant learners to strengthen their English communication skills in order to improve their employability, to transition into credit programs and certificate pathways, or to become active participants in their new community. The program serves a range of students with diverse socioeconomic and educational backgrounds. Approximately 12% of the students have less than 12 years of education, 37% of the students have a high school diploma, and 19%

of the students have a Bachelor's or advanced degree and/or professional license that they have earned in their native country. Over 48% of the students are between the ages of 30-45, and the majority are female (74%). The dominant ethnicities are Asian and Hispanic students; however, a range of language groups are often represented in the classrooms.

High School Referral

The High School Referral Program continues to be offered as a means to support noncredit basic skills development for concurrently enrolled high school students in the community. The average student is 17 years old, Hispanic/Latino (50%), and is attending to improve an existing low grade (D or F). While 65 high schools are serviced by the High School Referral Program, the highest number of students attend Diamond Bar (12%), Garey (12%), Los Altos (7%), or Walnut (6%) High Schools. The average student attends online and participates in class on a weekly basis. Students must have approval from their high school counselor and a parent to begin a course and can only take one course at a time.

Language Learning Center

Users of the LLC include both credit and noncredit students. Credit students are typically enrolled in language courses requiring completion of lab hours as assigned by their instructor. The vast majority of noncredit students attending the LLC are enrolled in the ESL Program or are on a waiting list to take ESL classes. These students are self-motivated individuals dedicated to practicing their English skills. Other noncredit students include community members who are looking to gain language skills for various purposes. The LLC offers incentives for students who achieve specific benchmarks set by each language program and offer self-directed learning activities in order to help students build autonomous and lifelong learning strategies.

Noncredit Health Careers

Although health could be considered another example of a vocational program, it is approached as a separate program from other vocational programs because of the entry requirements (e.g., physical examination, background check) as well as externships in clinical sites. Health Careers students seek opportunities for work or upward mobility in healthcare fields. Some are concurrently enrolled in credit, while others are healthcare workers or professionals seeking clinical skills upgrade. Many students participating in this program are preparing for health-related licensure or certification exams. Students in Personal Care Aide are seeking Short-Term training leading to employment; the majority of these students are unemployed, Hispanic/Latino women seeking an entry level healthcare position.

Off-Campus High School Program

Off-Campus High School (OCHS) partners with local high school districts to offer courses that students must retake to graduate from high school, as well as courses that provide opportunity for academic enrichment. The program supports students in their college and career pathways. The program helps students complete a high school diploma and transition into college and career pathways.

Short-Term Vocational Program

Students participating in the School of Continuing Education's Short-Term Vocational (STV) programs are seeking to complete certificate programs or courses leading to professional advancement or

employment. STV programs are designed to meet the need of the local economy and be as responsive as possible to labor market information. The courses lead to certificates in an array of careers such as health, business, agriculture, electronics, welding, and photography, to name a few. Short-Term Vocation certificates fall into two categories. The first group of certificates have been approved by the California Community Colleges Chancellor's Office. Students enroll in a STV program that may last anywhere from 6-18 weeks. Once they have successfully completed the program they will receive a Certificate of Completion. STV programs include Certified Nursing Assistant (CNA), Personal Care Aide (PCA), and Electronic Systems Technology (EST). Students may also earn a Certificate of Completion that "mirrors" a credit certificate. That is students can take the credit courses that make up a certificate for noncredit. Once the program is completed the student will receive a certificate and the courses and certificate will be reflected on their transcript. The courses and certificates are created and offered through a collaborative process with the various credit departments of the College. Many students take just one or two classes that will advance their work skills, and it is common for them to request evidence of completion of a single course to submit to their employer.

Vocational English as a Second Language (VESL)

Vocational English as a Second Language (VESL) students are primarily female (83%), almost half are between the ages of 30-45, and the dominant ethnicities are Asian and Latino/a students, however, a range of language groups are represented in the classroom. Approximately 5% of students have less than 12 years of education, 30% have a high school diploma, and 24% of students have a Bachelor's or advanced degree/professional license that they earned in their native country.

Vocational Re-Entry (VRE)

Vocational Re-Entry (VRE) students are primarily women (74%), and over the age of 65 (69%). These students enroll in classes to learn digital literacy and new vocational skills that they use to participate in the community, volunteer, start their own business, or begin their encore career. Classes are offered online, on campus, and off campus in partnership with community organizations. Many students are looking to improve their technology skills and earn certificates in Office Computer Applications. A typical VRE student enrolls in multiple classes each term and continues to participate in the program throughout the academic year (70%).

WIN Program

The WIN Program is comprised of student athletes who are enrolled in credit courses. The average student is between the ages of 18-20 and 24 sports are represented with the largest being football and track. All participating students must take a minimum of 12 credit units in order to be eligible to participate in a sport while in season and most will take between 12 and 15 credit units per semester.

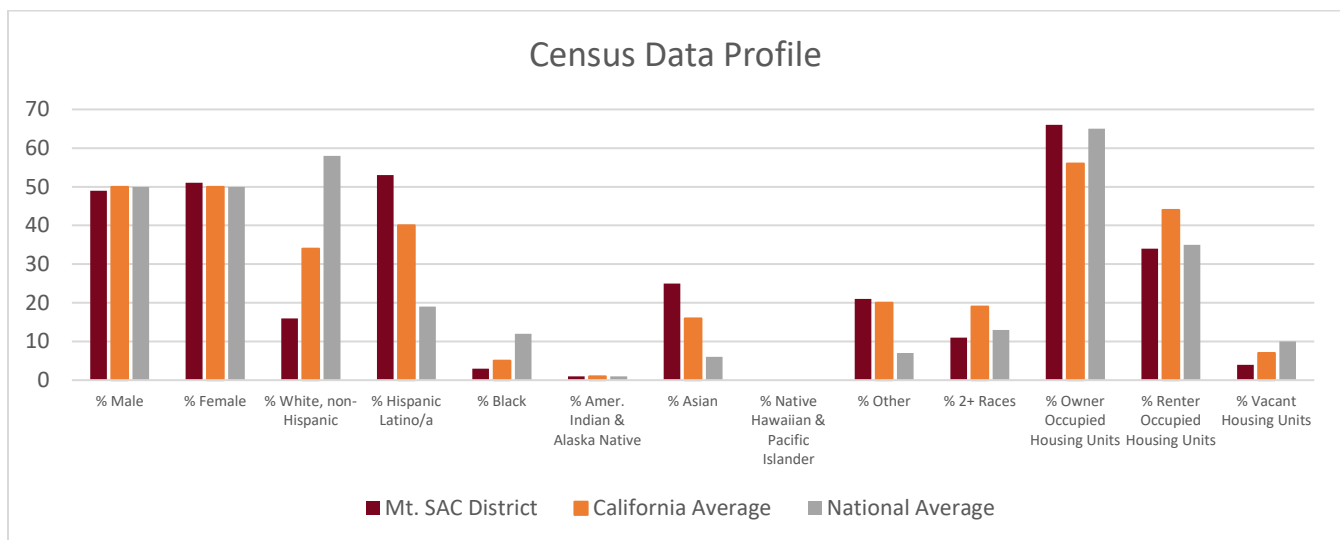

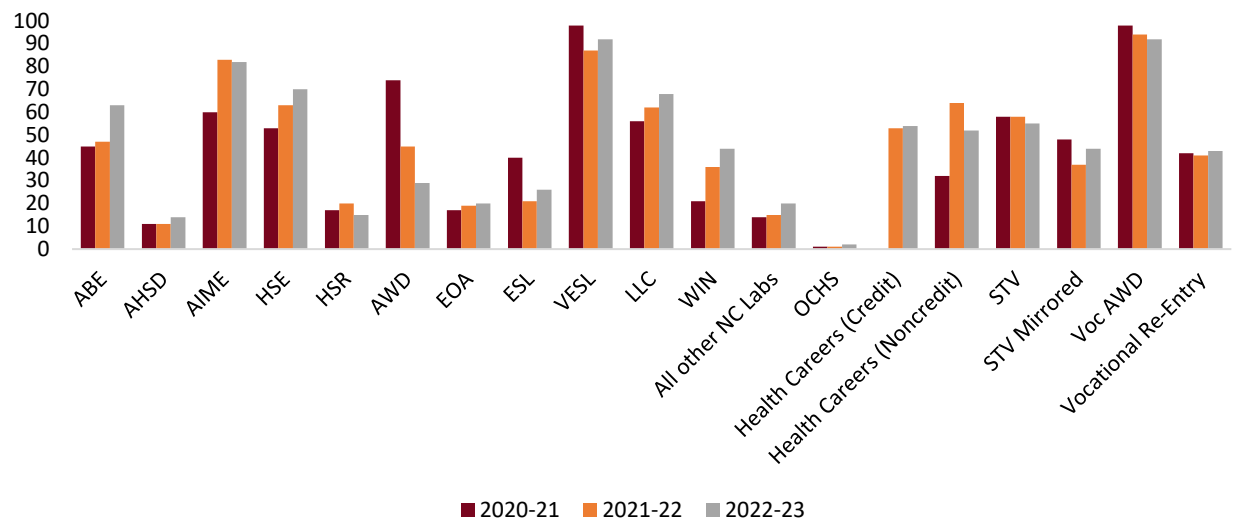

SCE Concurrent Enrollment Within Noncredit Program (By Percentage)

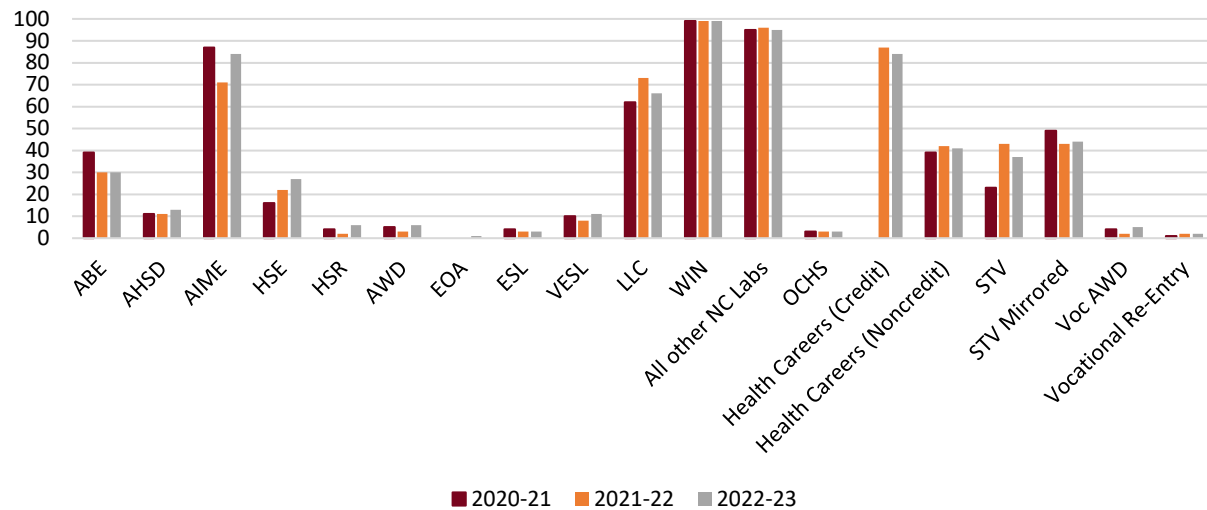

SCE Credit Concurrent Enrollment by Program (By Percentage)

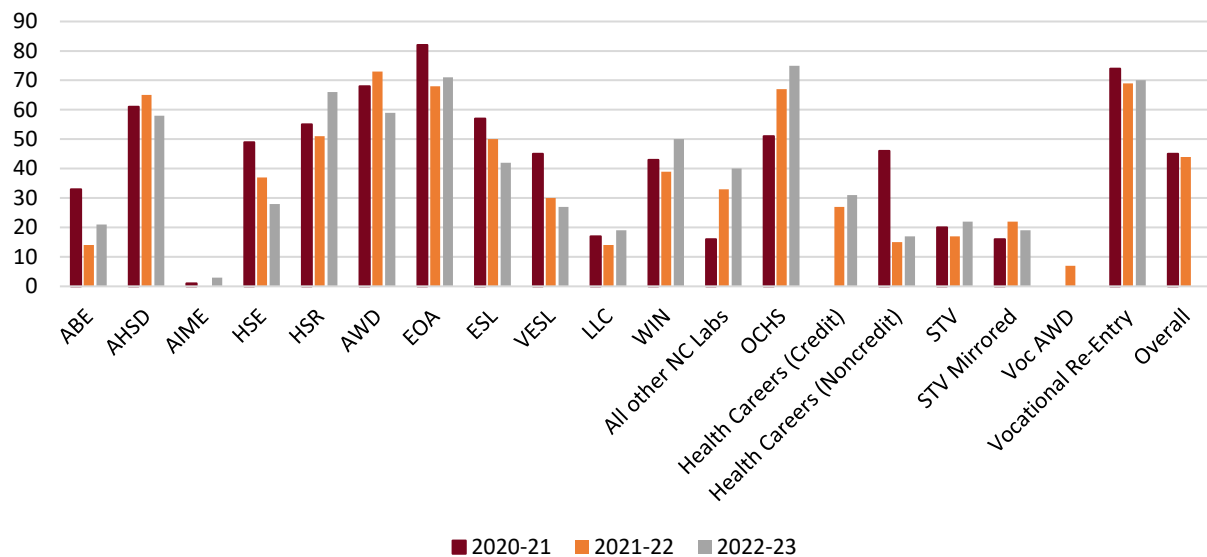

Student Mobility (Persistence Rate) by Program

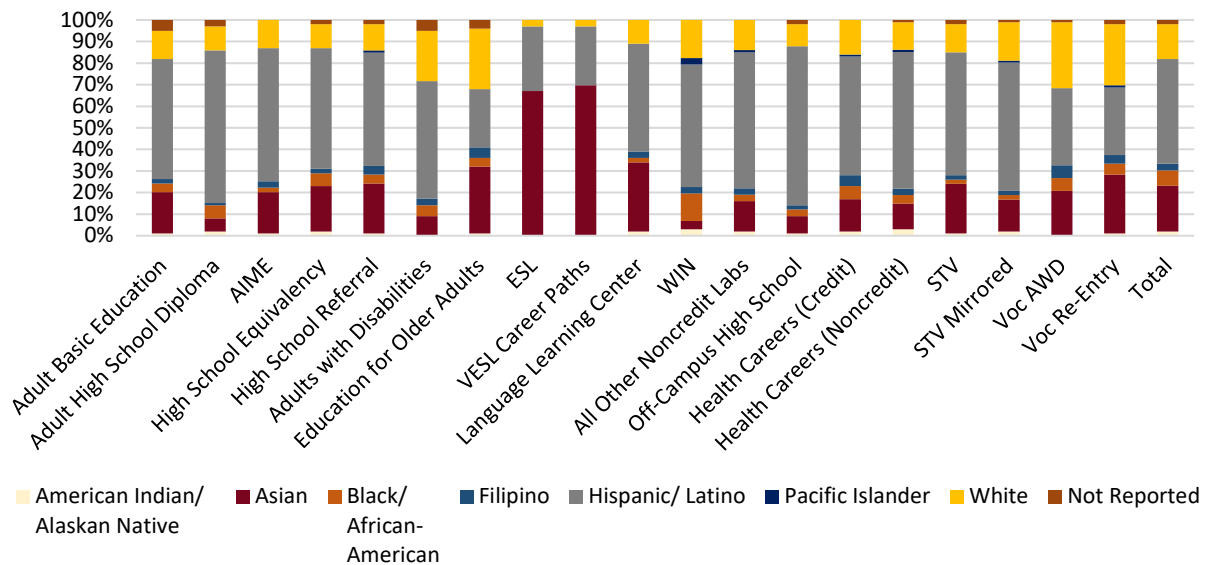

Student Ethnicity by Program 2022-23

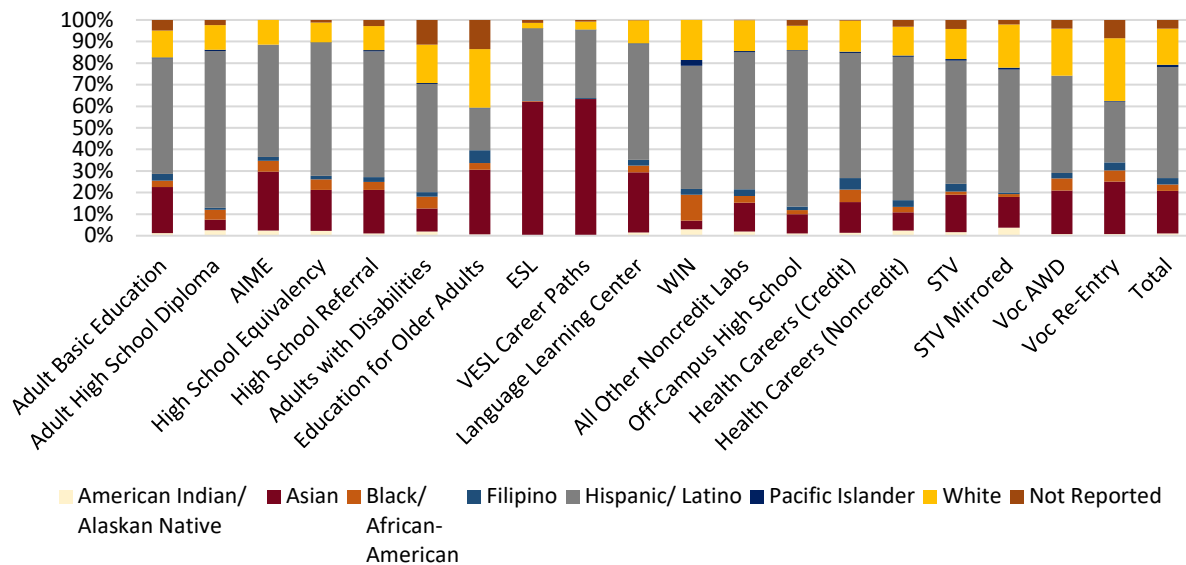

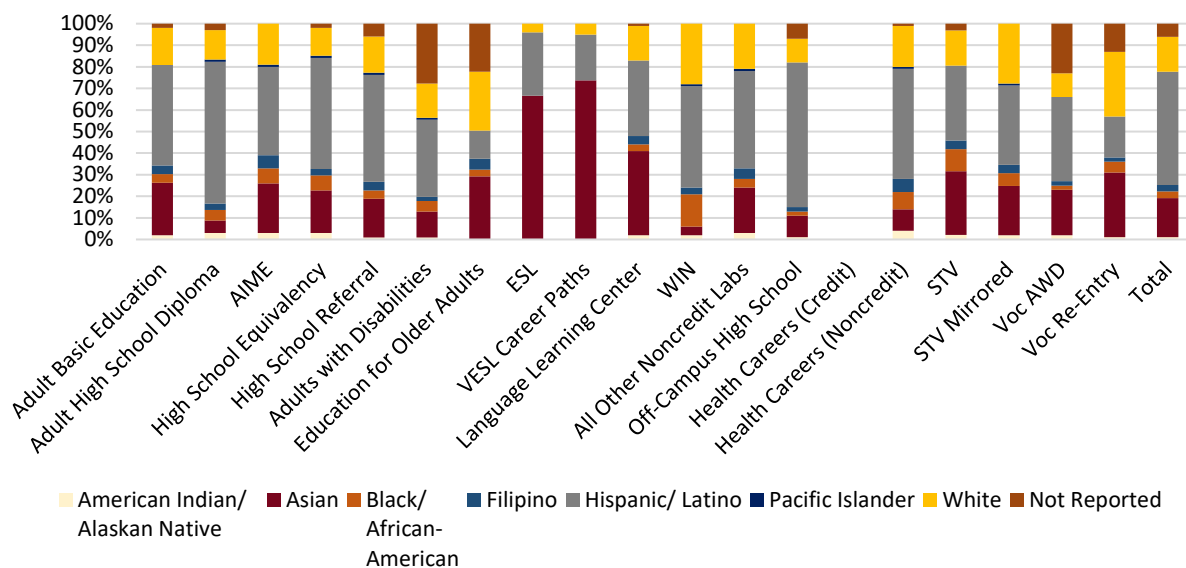

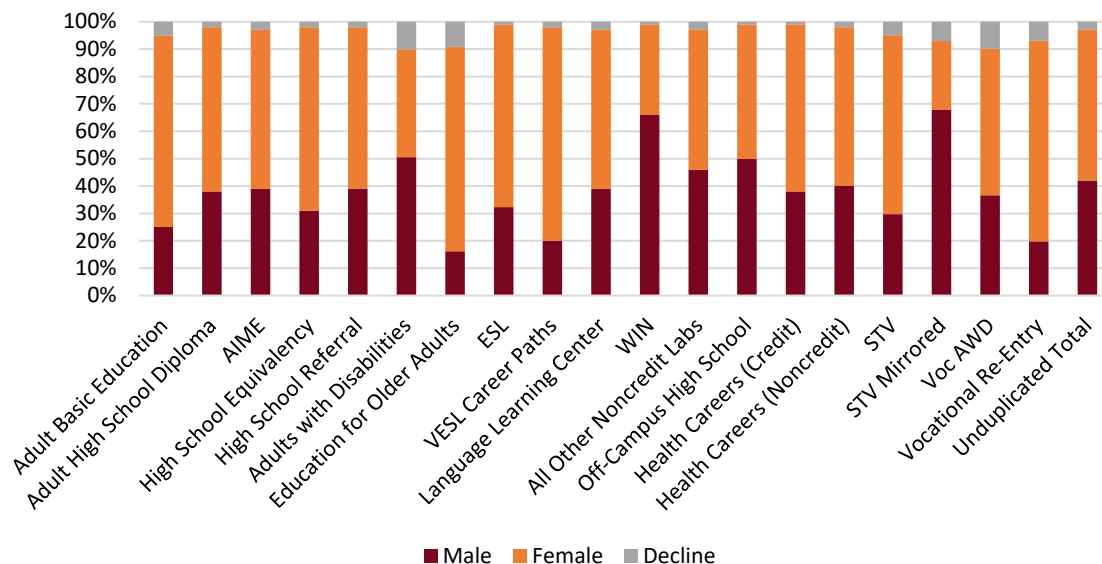

Student Gender by Program 2022-23

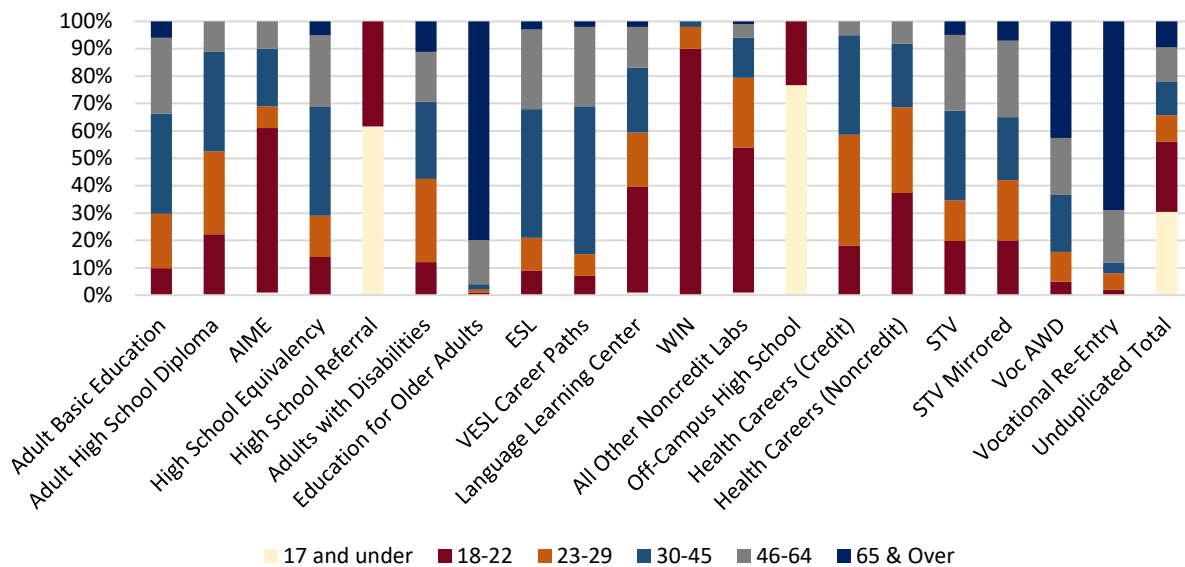

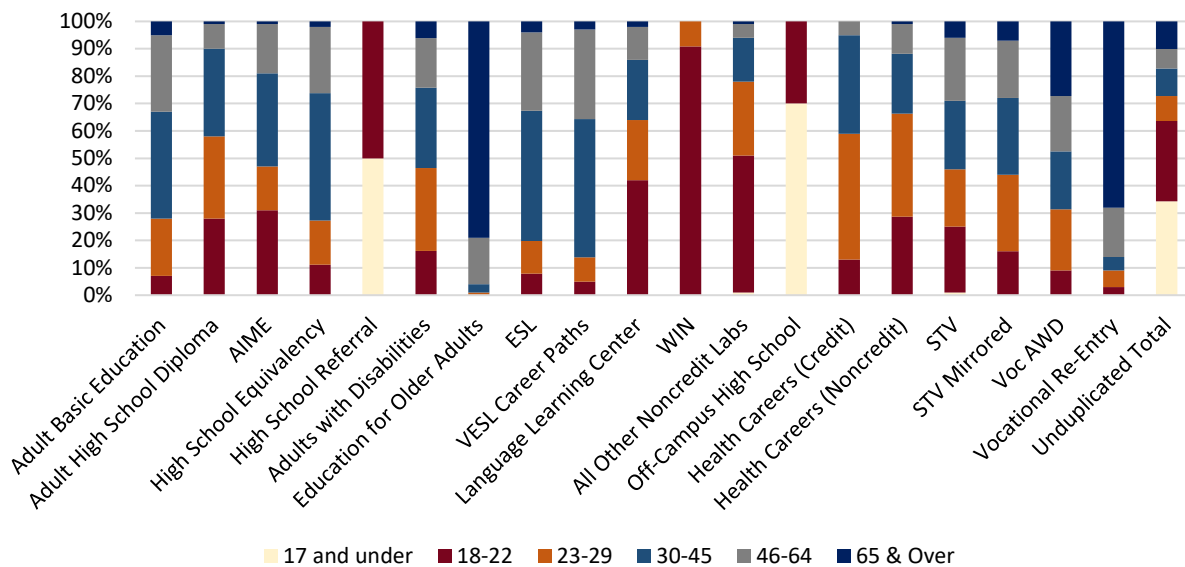

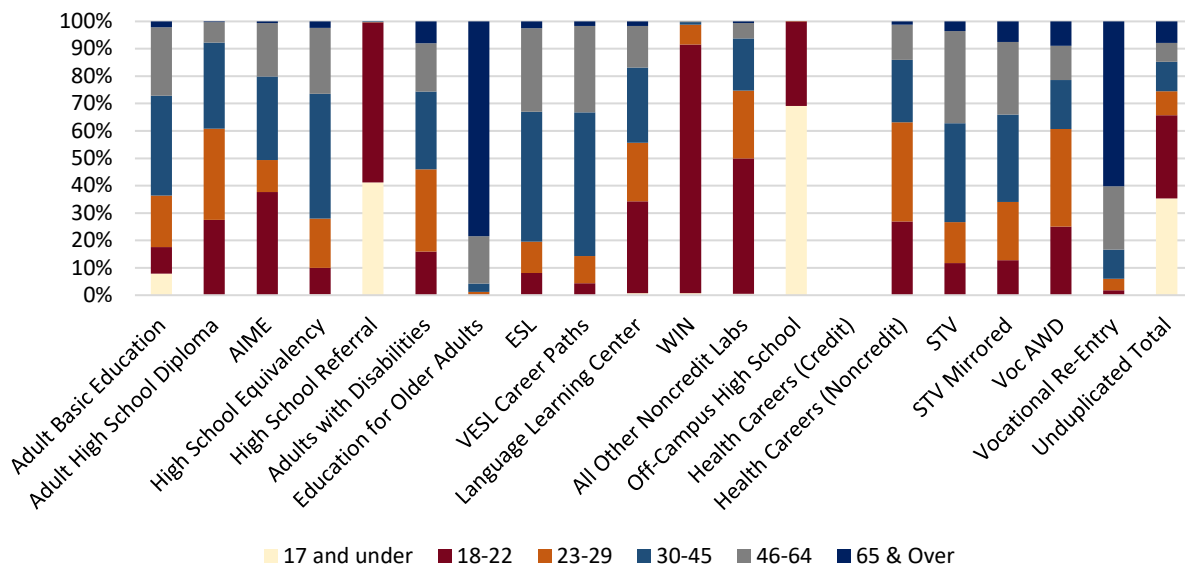

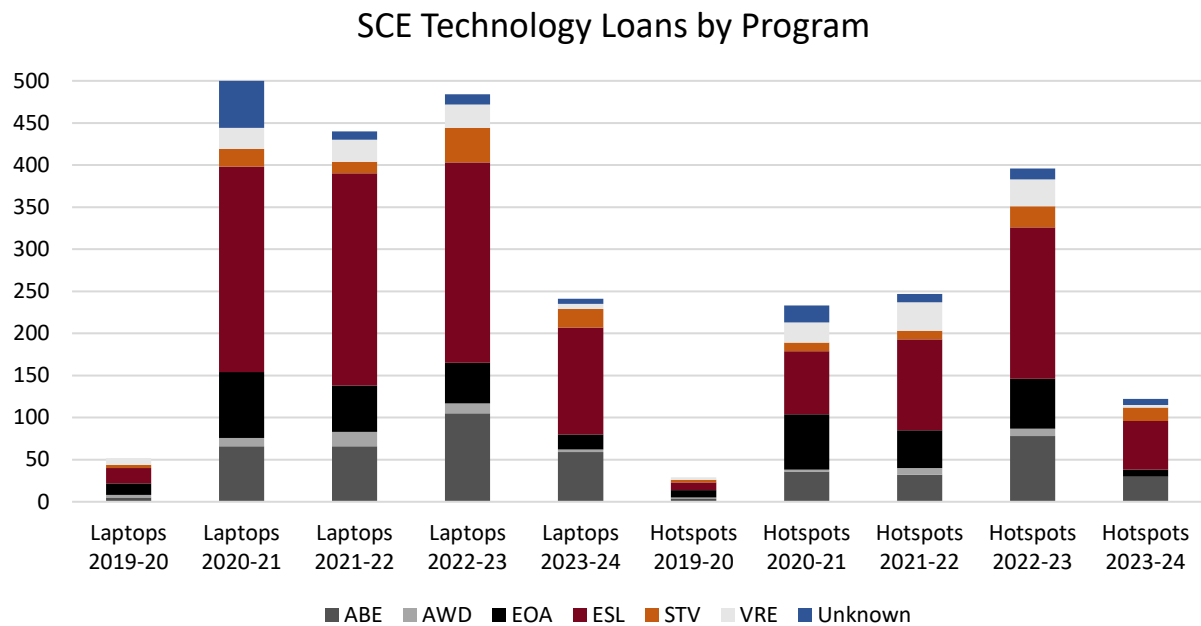
Student Age by Program 2020-21

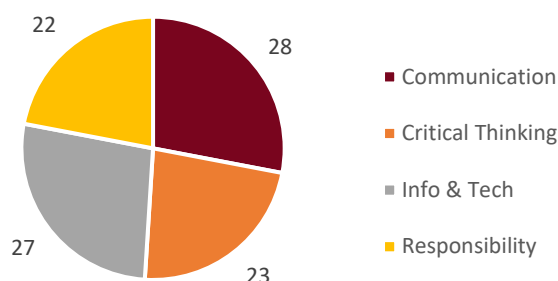

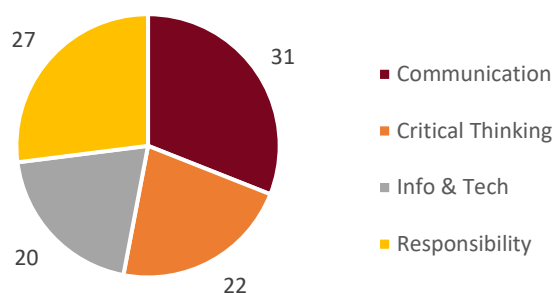

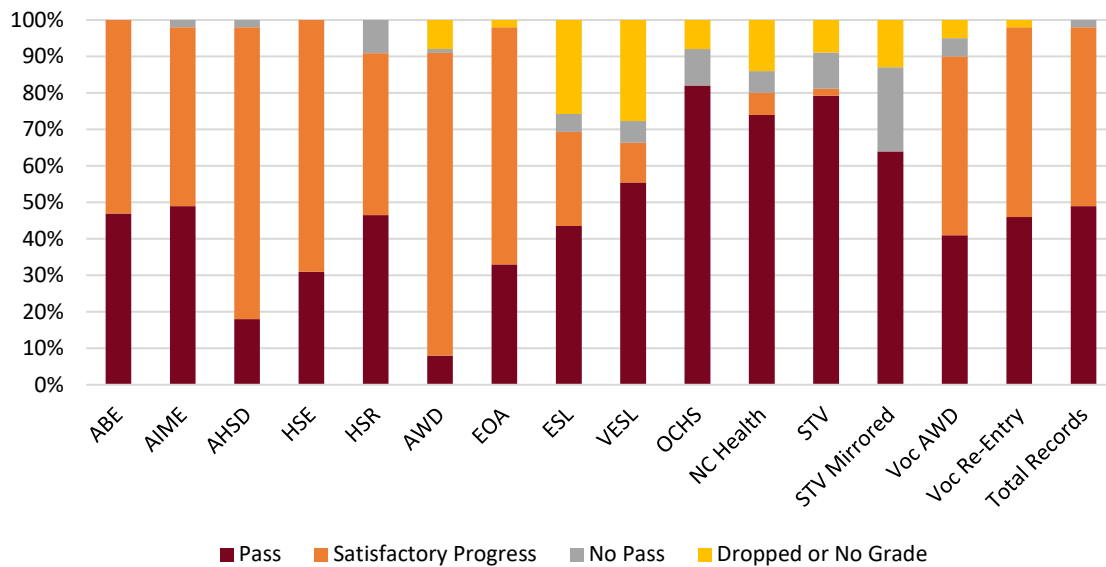

SCE Student Grades by Program for 2022-23

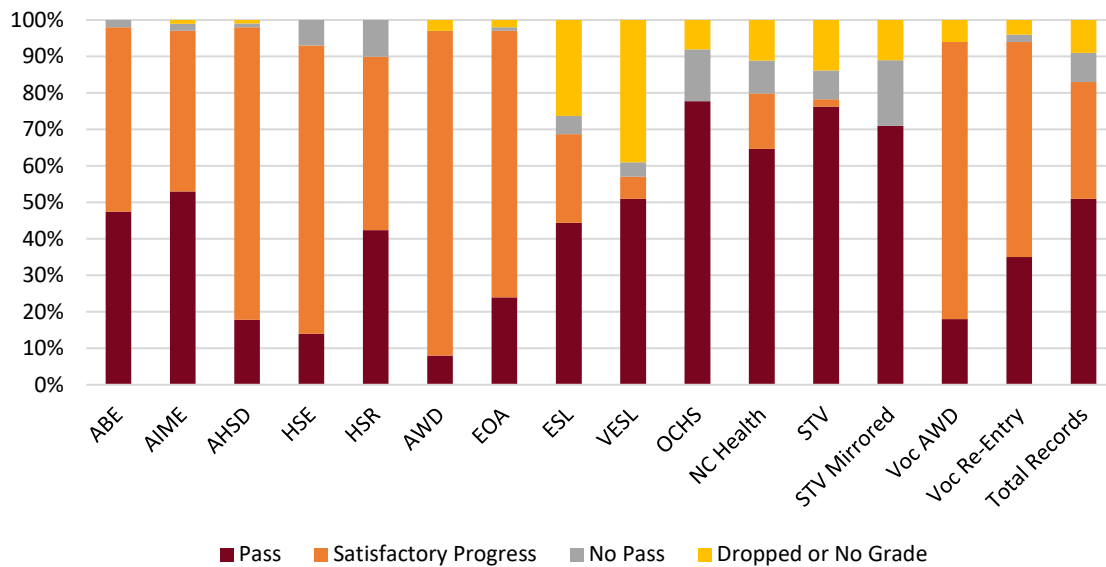

SCE Student Grades by Program for 2021-22



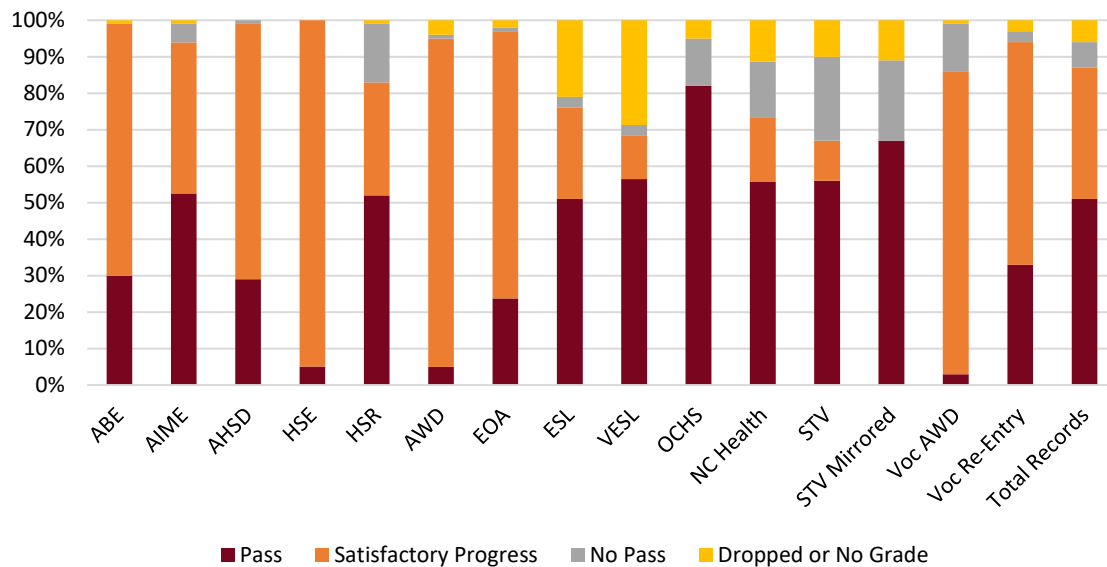

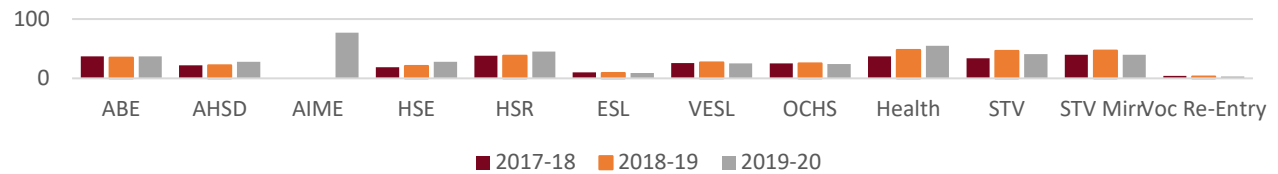
SCE Student Grades by Program for 2020-21

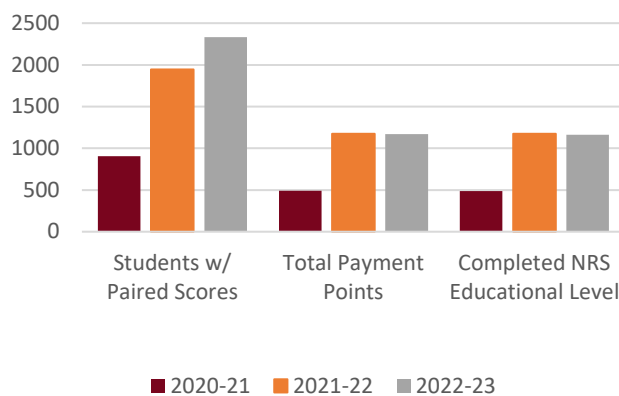

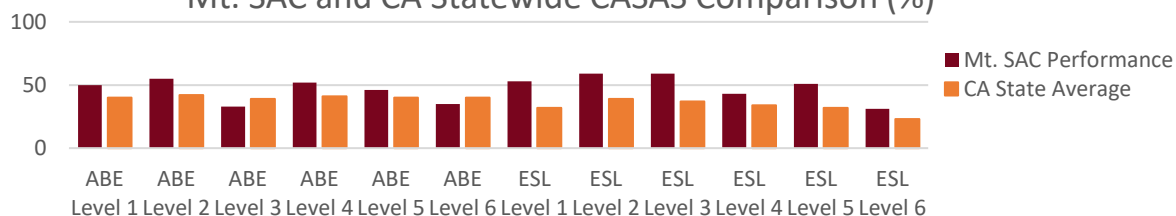

Mt. SAC and CA Statewide CASAS Comparison (%)



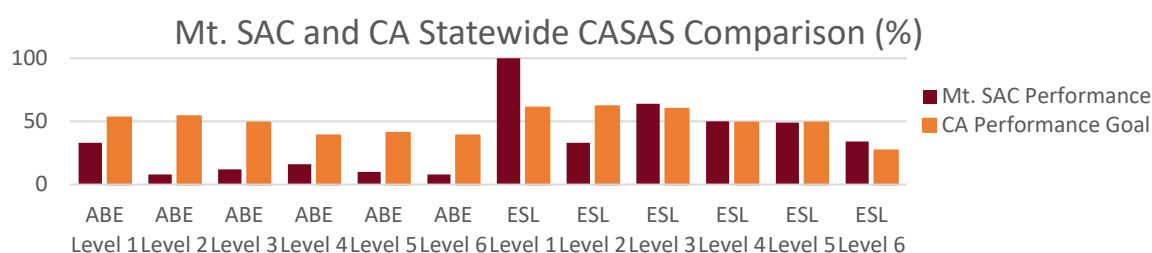

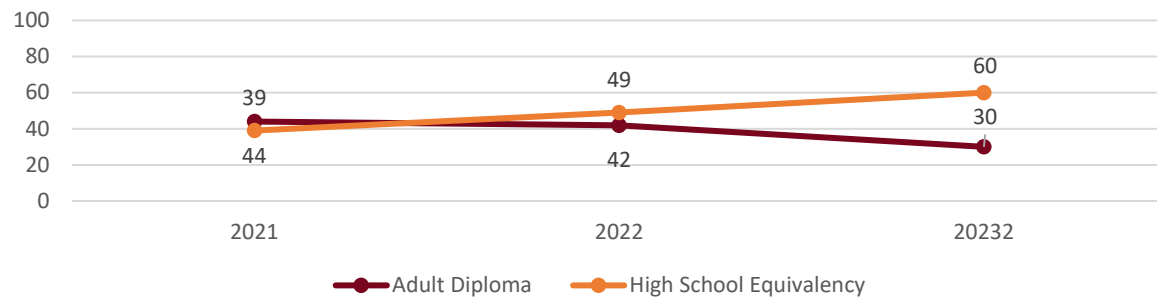

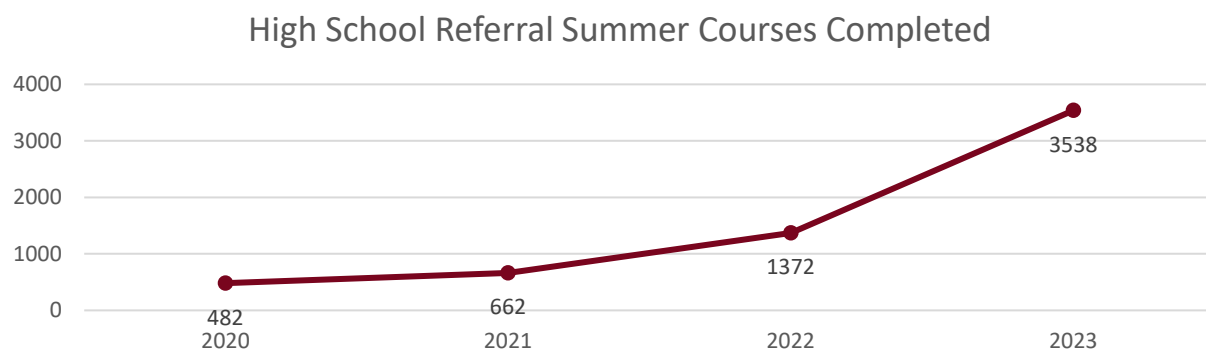

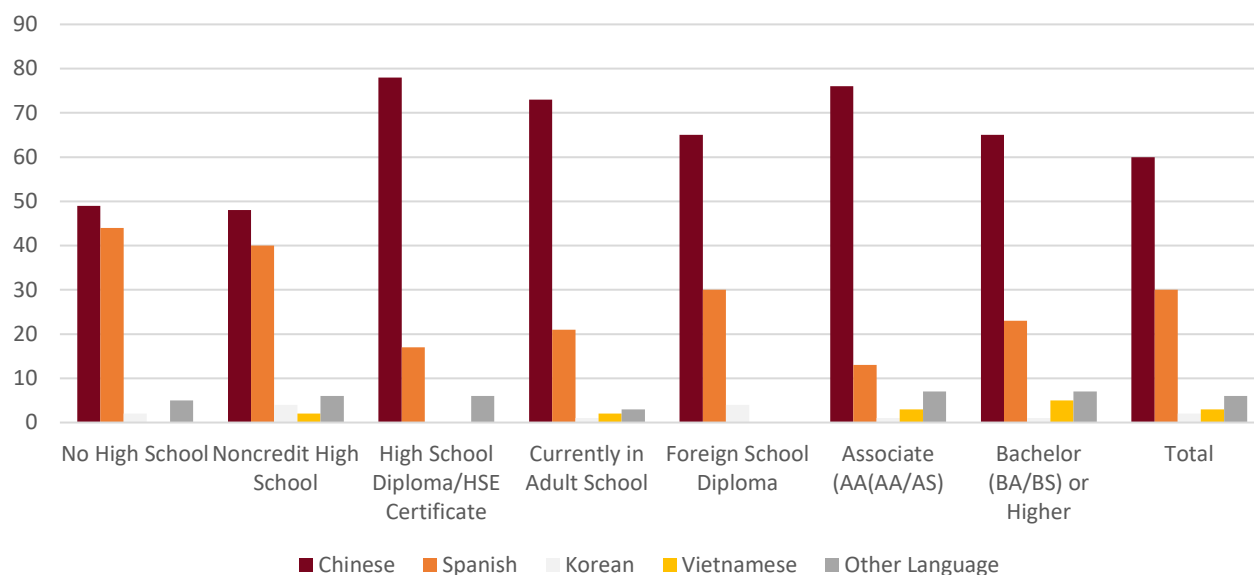

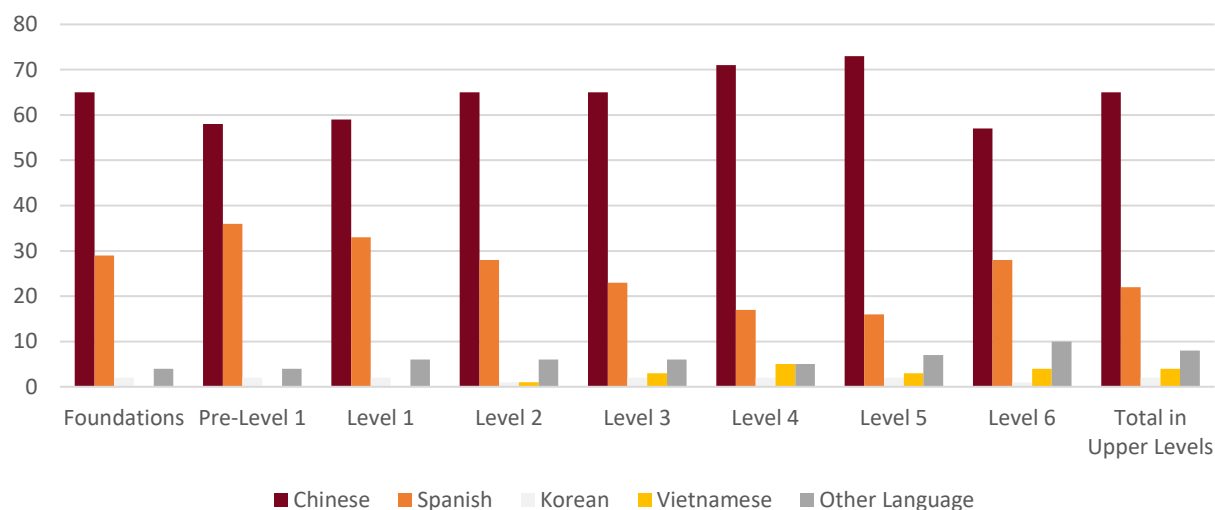

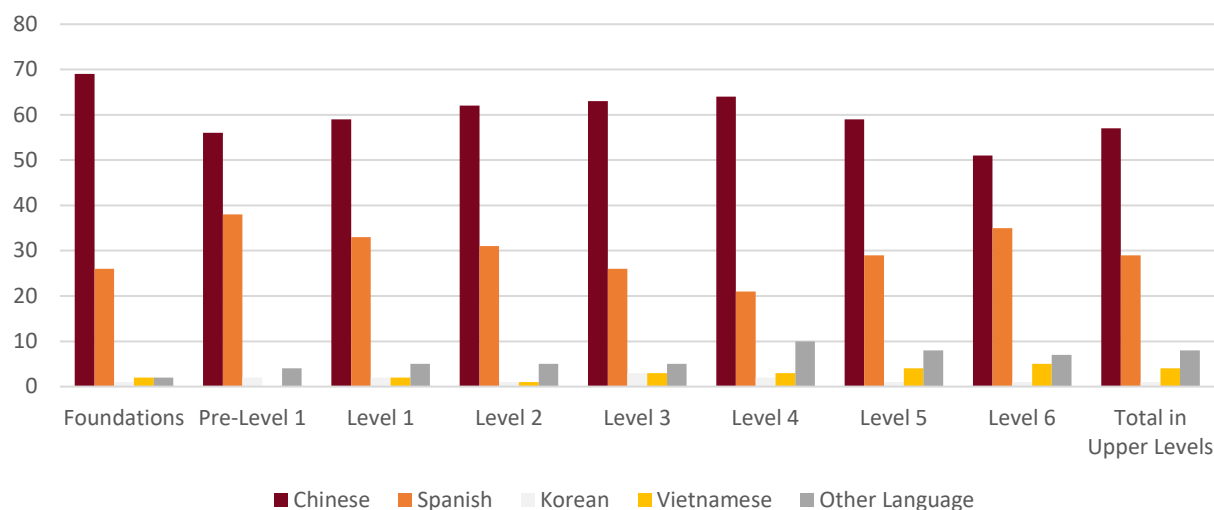
ESL Student Education Level and Previous English Study

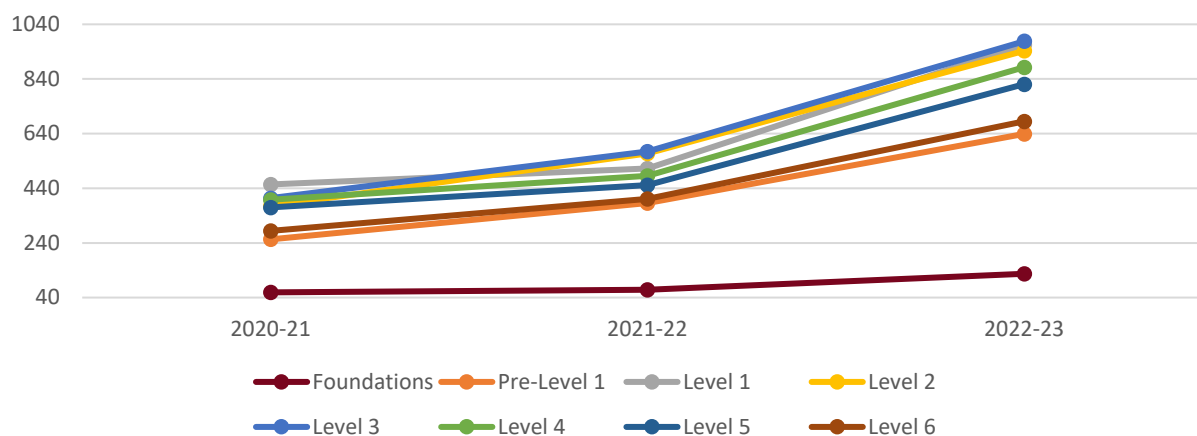
ESL Student Education Level and Previous English Study
(percentage by Language Background)



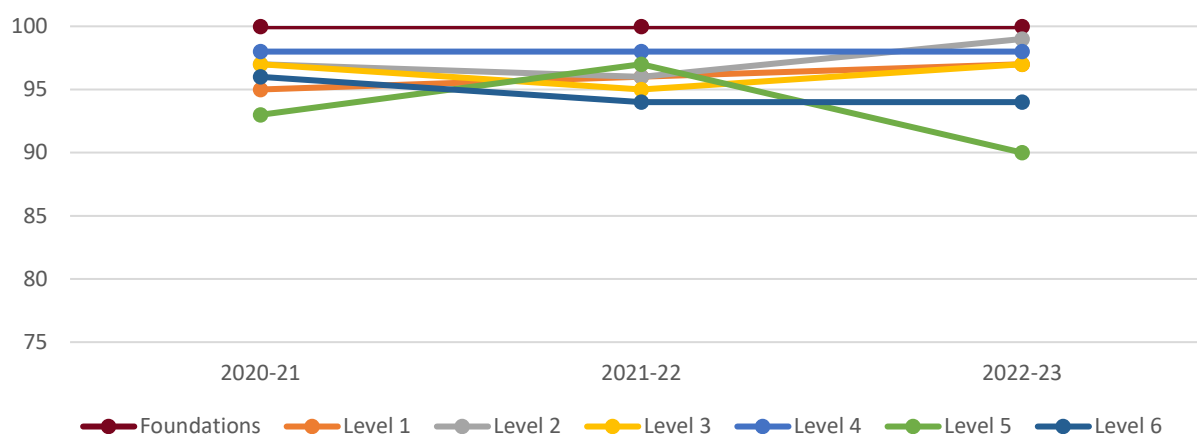

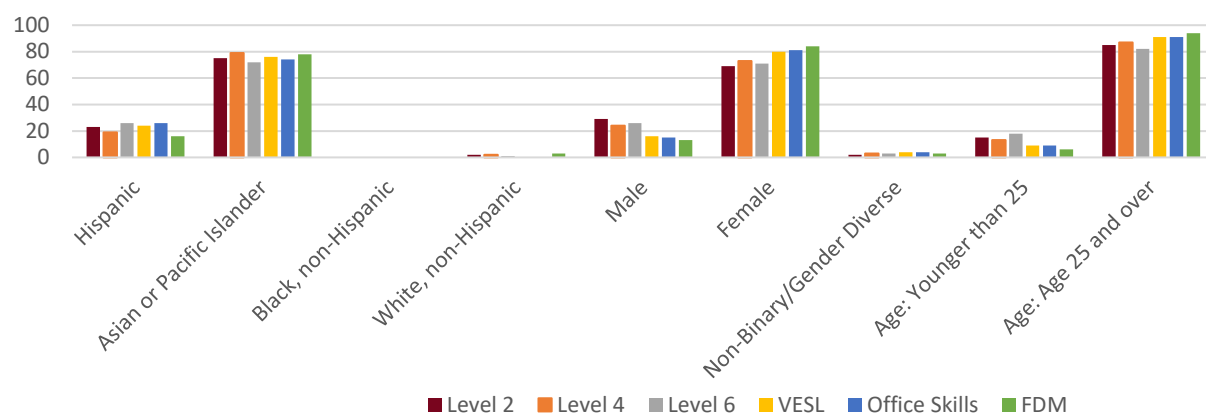

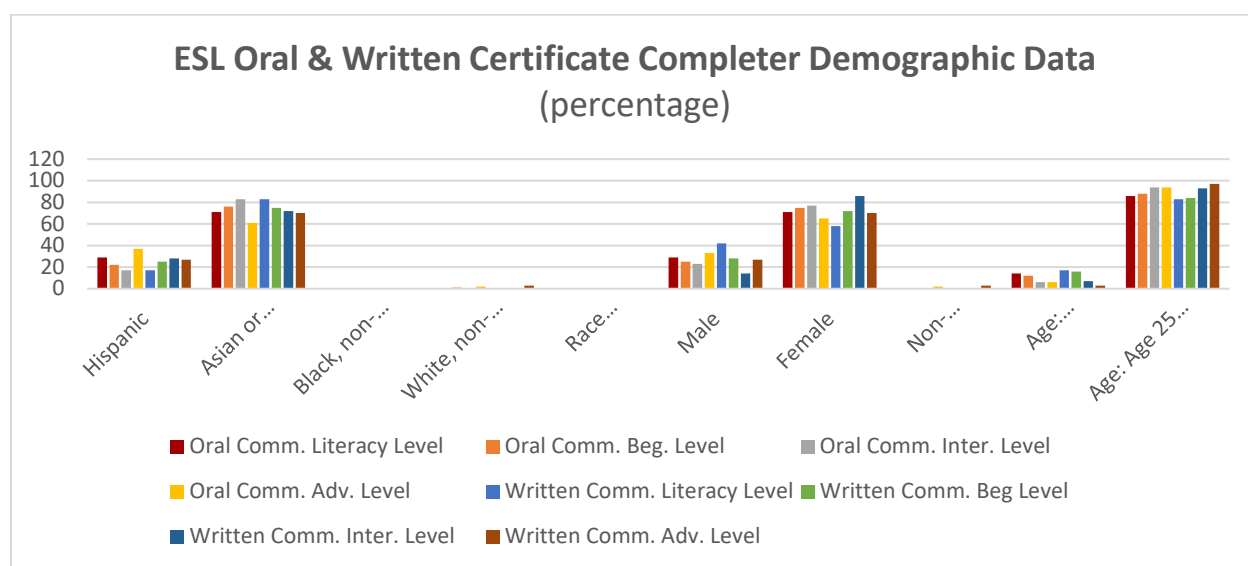

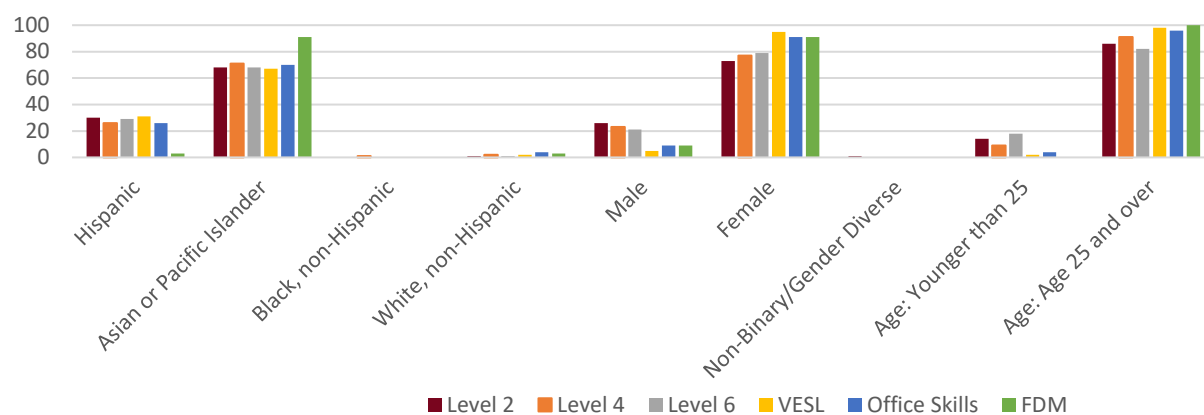

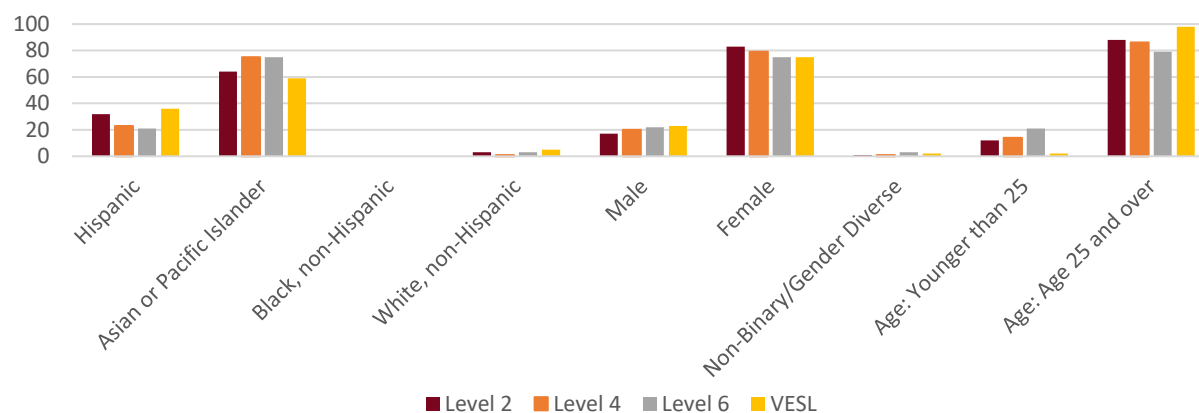
ESL Level Completer Demographic Data (by percentage)

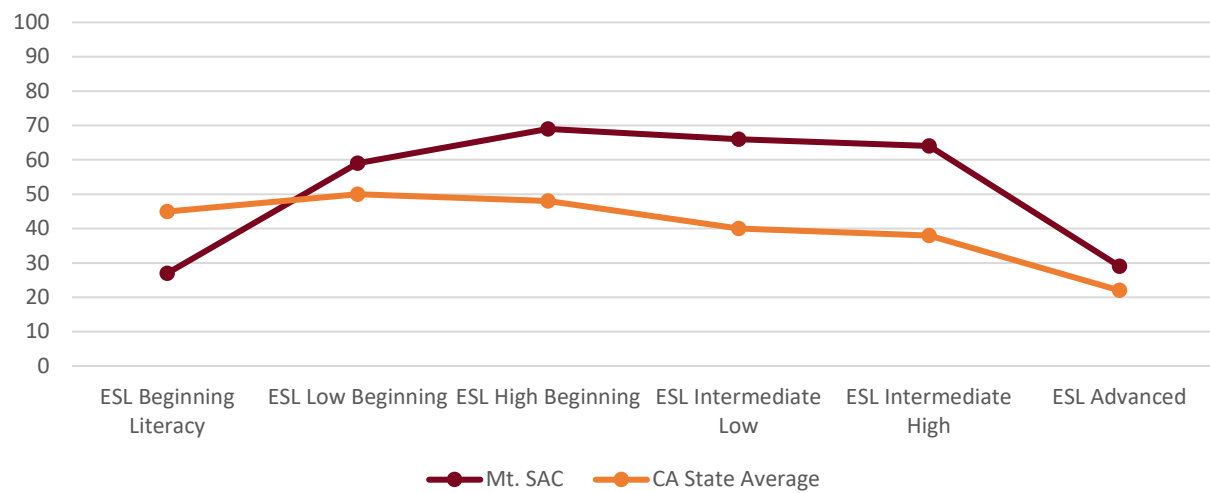
ESL Level Completer Demographic Data (by percentage)

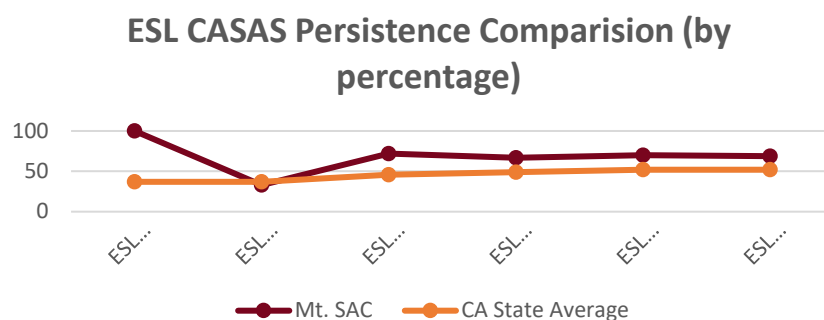
ESL CASAS Persistence Comparison (by percentage)

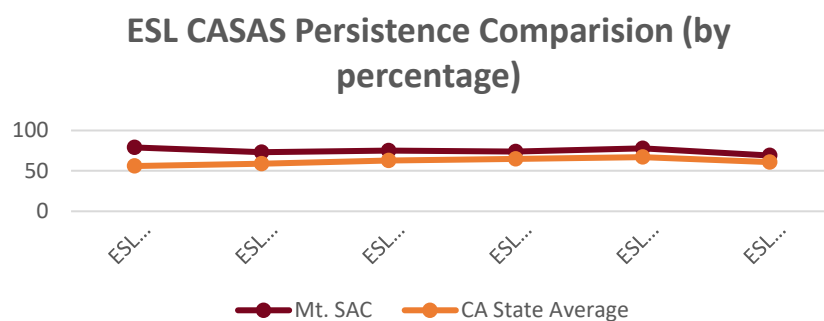

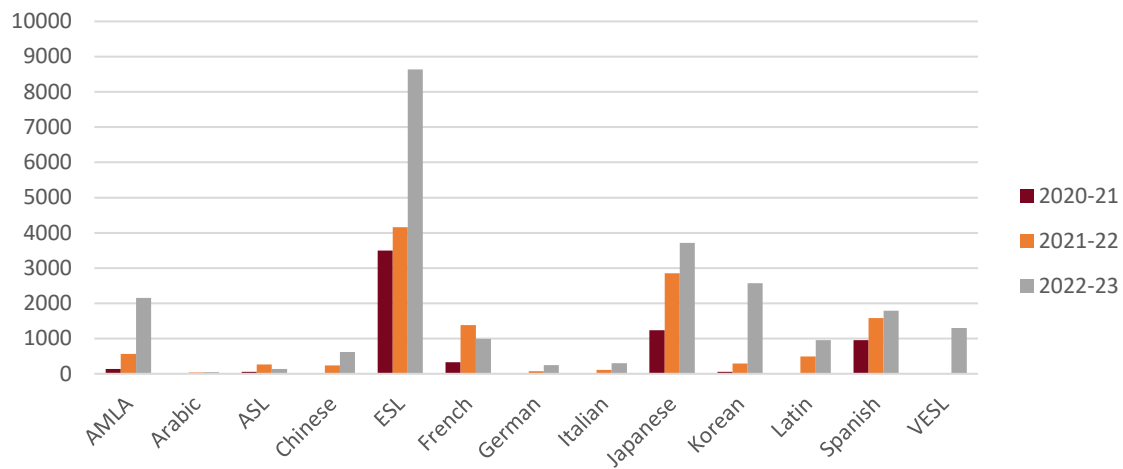

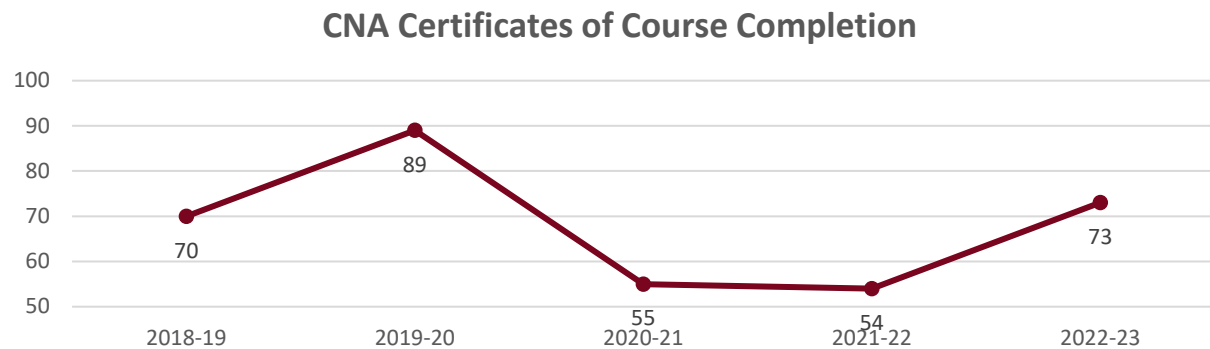
LLC Student Usage Hours by Language

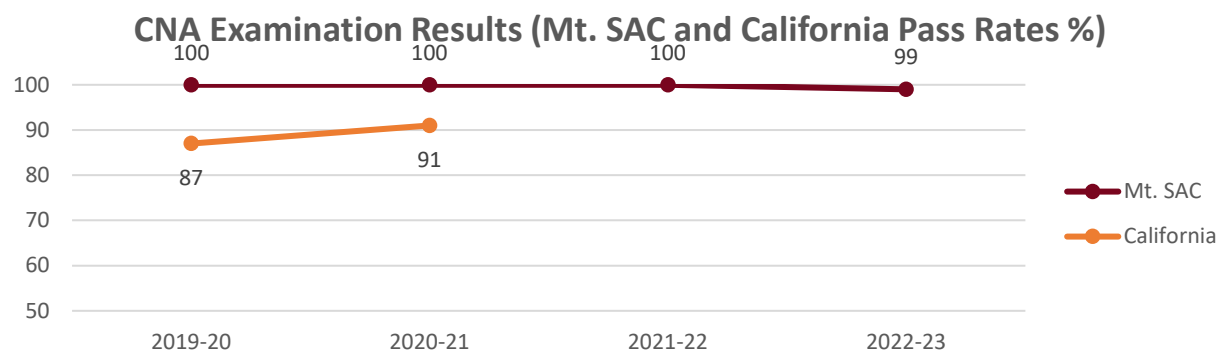

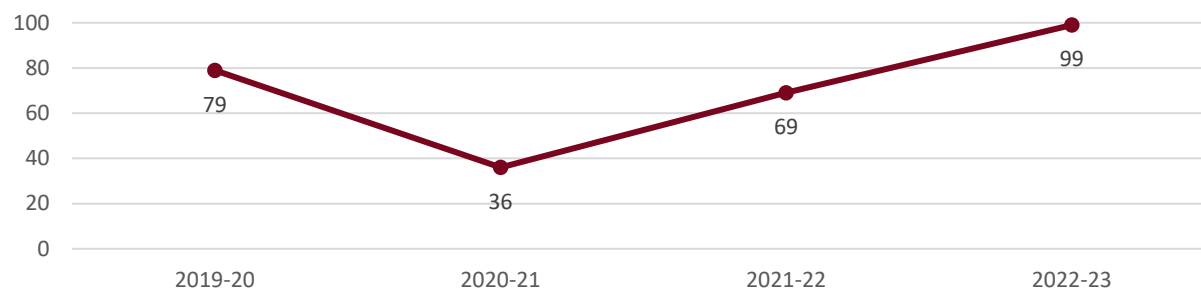

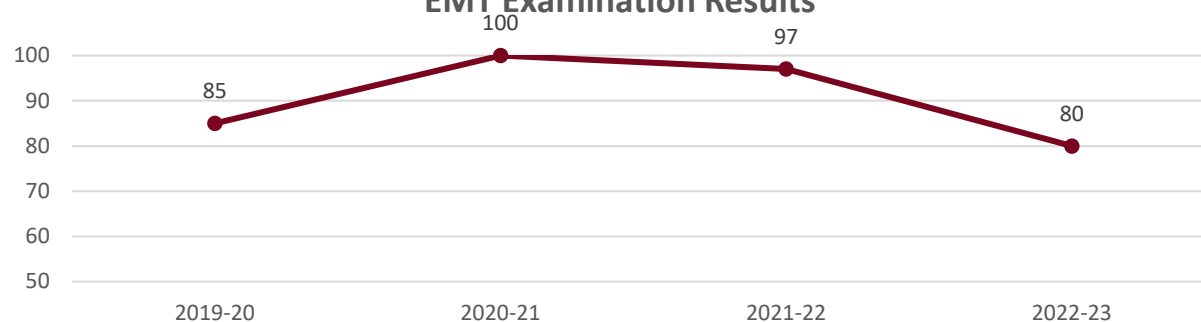
EMT Certificates of Course Completion

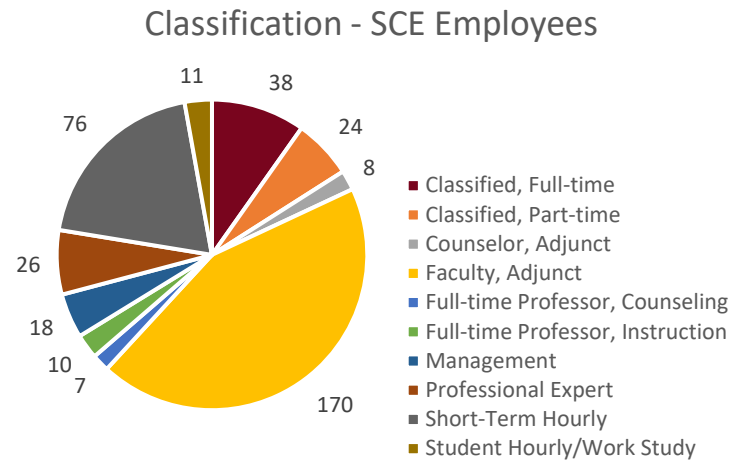

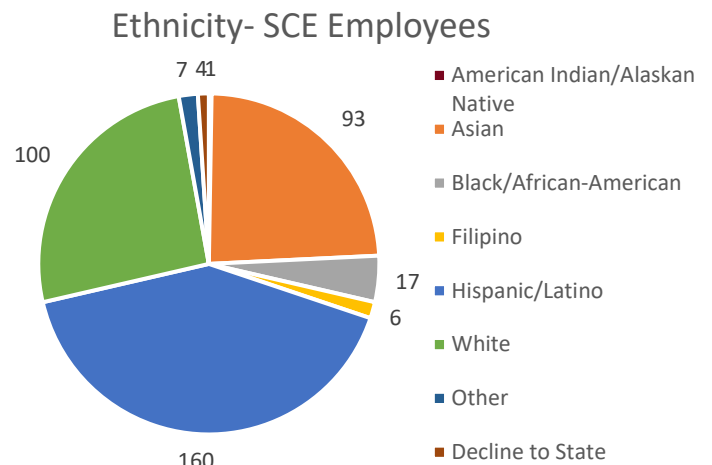

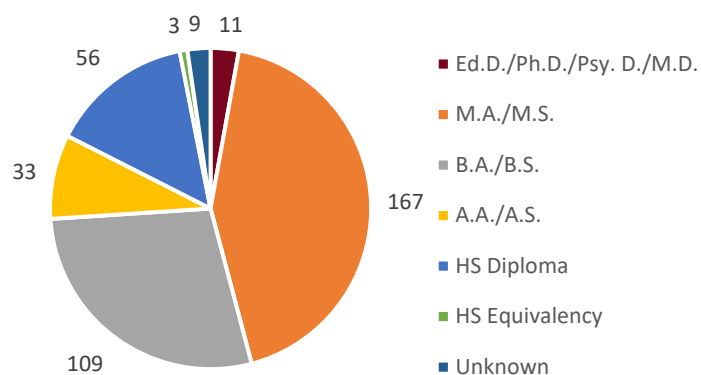

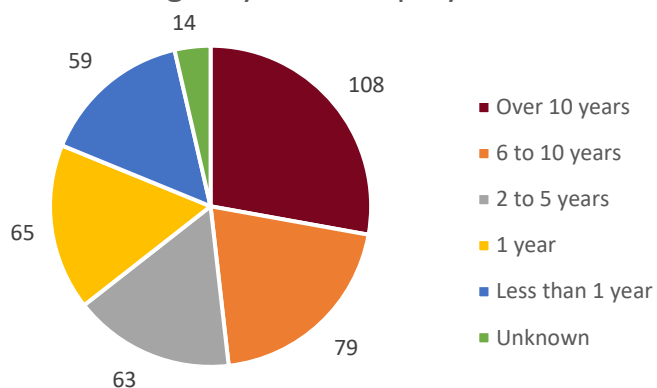
