#### Inside the Sim Lab

The Sim Lab is setup like a hospital unit and each bedside has working equipment such as hospital beds, monitors, whiteboard, headwalls with simulated oxygen and suction to create an environment of realism.

The students can gain experience in utilizing a wide range of case scenarios. The students have the ability performs skills, such as vital signs, NGT placement, urinary catheter placement, assessment of breath sounds and heart sounds, IV access, and a head-to-toe assessment.
