Winter 2024 registration starts on Monday, November 6.

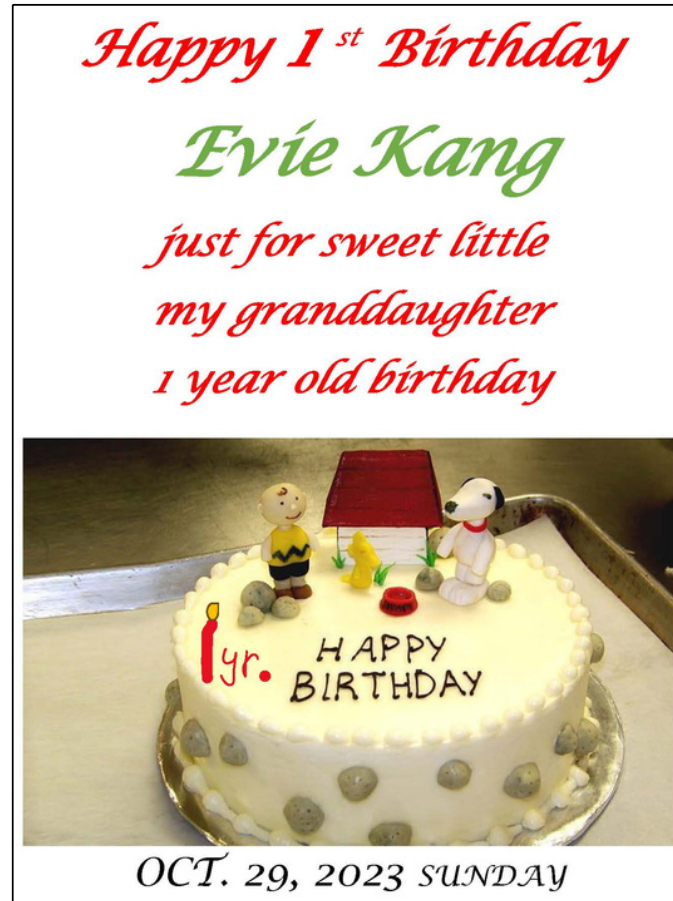
Registration Cards: Cards must be filled out completely (including A#) and submitted to the office by the professor. Students should not submit directly to the office.

Kudos! *Allison Medina*



Allison has effectively implemented the use of “equity sticks” in her classes. Equity sticks are a tool that teachers can use to prevent bias, even unintended bias, when it comes time to call on students in the classroom. Made from popsicle sticks or craft sticks, each equity stick has a student’s name written on them, and they’re placed in a jar where a teacher can easily access them to pull names.

The goal is to ensure that every student has a chance at equal participation. In turn, that can have a significant impact on how students learn and their successes. One study regarding student achievement in relation to being called on in the classroom found that Hispanic students’ grades improved more than 10 percent when they got an equal opportunity to respond, while the amount of schoolwork they turned in jumped by 15 percent.

SLOs

Student Learning Outcomes (SLOs) are assessed in each course that we offer. SLOs are mapped to Institutional Level Outcomes (ILOs). Previously, we looked at SLOs from all three program areas together. Our programs are growing both in terms of enrollment, but also in terms of new curriculum. As we've added new classes we saw a need to redo our mapping. Now, each program area has courses tied to each ILO.

Behavior and Wellness Team (BWT)

BWT is a multidisciplinary campus team that guides the campus community in effectively assessing and addressing concerning behavior. BWT aims to assist students who may be experiencing an emotional problem before their behavior reaches a potentially dangerous level.

BWT does not respond to emergency or crisis situations. If you have urgent concerns regarding possible suicide or violence please call 911 to speak with an Emergency Services Dispatcher. After reporting the crisis to 911, please submit a BWT referral in order for BWT to follow up.

What happens when I make a referral to B&WT?

A submitted referral goes directly to a case manager for review during regular College business hours. Depending on the nature of the concern, the case managers work together to determine the best course of action on the student's behalf. In most cases, the outcome of the initial assessment is to offer support and resources to the student of concern, the reporter, or both.
