



Where We've Been and Where We Are



0 SCE Students Are BACK!!

- Additional 4,758 students served in Contract/Community Ed in 2021-22
 - 271% increase from last year and about 3,500 more students!
 - 13 more classes than last year!
 - College for Kids in person for this summer!
- Continuous noncredit growth since Summer 2021 with almost 1400 noncredit FTES increase since 2020-21





How is SCE funded?

- Unrestricted General Funds district funds
 - We earn our UGFs from student attendance in noncredit classes
 - State funds pay for staff, faculty, supplies, equipment, conferences/professional development
- Restricted funds grant/categorical funds
 - State and federal (WIOA, CAEP, SEAP, Strong Workforce, Appropriations, HEERF/COVID relief)
 - Awards Lumina Foundation, Chancellor's Office Apprenticeships)
 - Can only spend this money on specific populations or uses
- Community and Contract Education (fees, contracts, state funds)
