ESA March 7th, 2016 Meeting

- 1. Minutes from December meeting were approved.
- 2. **Division Office administrative concerns**. Several faculty members report very slow turnaround for conference reimbursement. Paperwork held up at Div. Office. The Redinger scholarship is supposed to be collected at the Division Office and last week one of Tania's students was turned away trying to hand in the application. Becca reports that the Island Packers outfitters for the oceanography field trip still has not been paid from November and the list of student i.d.s is still at the Division Office and has not made it to the Bursar. People who subbed for faculty in the fall 2015 still have not been paid. The Vernier equipment order (that was to be used in classes last fall) was held up at the Division level so much that it had to be re-ordered. The Division Office has not given us the PIE document we need for equipment requests. Student learning is being impacted because our field trips are in danger (vendors who do not get paid might not work with us any more), student scholarships are jeopardized. Employee relations are being impacted because people are not getting paid for their work. Mike made a Google doc to track our Division Office paperwork submissions and response time in order to document our grievances.
- 3. **Adjunct evaluations:** Julie sent the list from fall. Faculty that have not submitted all the paperwork to Mark and the Division Office should do so now.
- 4. **Senate report** (Becca): nothing to report
- 5. **Faculty Association report** (Mike): An email tracking research project is taking place. Let Kalumagi know if you want to participate. We discussed plan to turn public safety into a police dept. FA is against it. Our Department wants more information to decide where we stand. The informal discussion tended toward not wanting the change to happen.
- 6. **Planetarium / observatory update** (Heather): (a) The elevator is broken again. Matt Judd was contacted about the broken email on Fri 3/4 but he has not responded. (b) We discussed the total eclipse coming in August 2017 and perhaps offering a bus trip to Wyoming to observe it. We could work with the Mt SAC Foundation and get sponsorship. We would link on-campus events with the field trip for people unable to travel. We will form a planning committee. (c) Mark will introduce the March 24 von Karman lecture. *Also see attached report from Heather*.
- 7. **New course** Dave Mrofka "Global Climate Change" is being sent to Curriculum. The Department approves sending this for consideration as a Mt. SAC GE course and to get it marked as CSU and UC transferable.
- 8. **Division meeting report** (Mark): (a) Tenured faculty members need to keep up with what year they are in for review process and complete all forms. (b) Faculty, send your syllabi and "welcome back" forms as soon as possible in order to get paid properly. (c) Next year is the last year of the extra instructional equipment request funds so they need to be in PIE and be tied to outcomes. *Note: Division Office informs us that the PIE document is not ready yet, so we can't put items in PIE yet*. (d) Dave will start a Google doc spreadsheet for people to add requests (include

price, vendor info and shipping) (e) AACC Pathways program: Mt. SAC is a pilot program – it has directive counseling and scaling up of existing programs such as BRIDGE, etc. This program might include student research pathways so we should find out more about it.

- 9. SLOs/GEOs. Julie again requests the data that she asked for in August 2015!
- 10. **Mark Koestel / resource room**. Mark B. asks the Department to comment on Mark K.'s job description.
- 11. **Purchasing deadline is now**. Get your requests to Julie by March 8. The Dept. will request a new color laser printer.
- 12. Schedule (summer & fall): Instructors, send your requests to Julie.
- 13. Astronomy Kepler scholarship dinner is on April 9, 2016.
- 14. **Chair election nomination** opens this week. Craig is organizing. Addendum 5/9/16: Tania Anders nominated Mike Hood and Dave Mrofka seconded the nomination.
- 15. **Redinger Grant applications** are due this week. Mark will collect them from the Division Office and then we will form a review committee.



With visualizations based on satellite monitoring data and advanced supercomputer simulations, this cutting-edge production follows a trail of energy that flows from the Sun into the interlocking systems that shape our climate: the atmosphere, oceans, and biosphere. Audiences will ride along on swirling ocean and wind currents, dive into the heart of a monster hurricane, come face-to-face with sharks and gigantic whales, and fly into rolling volcanoes.
