

Hazing Transparency Report

In accordance with the federal **Stop Campus Hazing Act (SCHA)**, section 485 (f) of the **Higher Education Act of 1965**, and **California Penal Code § 245.6 (Matt’s Law)**, Mt. San Antonio College is committed to maintaining a safe environment for all students. The College publishes this report to provide transparency regarding student organizations found responsible for hazing violations.

This report also complies with **California Education Code §§ 66310–66312**, ensuring that the campus community remains informed of the conduct and history of student organizations.

Scope and Definitions

The College defines hazing as any act or situation created for the purpose of joining, initiating, maintaining membership in, or being accepted by a student group, regardless of a person's willingness to participate.

Hazing includes any action take that:

- Endangers the mental or physical health or safety of another person
- Causes humiliation, harassment, or intimidation
- Involves forced or coerced consumption of alcohol, drugs, or other substances
- Requires illegal, dangerous, or demeaning acts

Per federal and state requirements, this report includes:

- A general description of the incident(s)
- The organizations or groups involved
- Investigation outcomes
- Disciplinary sanctions or corrective actions

Reporting Policy

- **Retention:** In compliance with the SCHA, findings of responsibility will remain on this public report for a period of five (5) years.
- **Exclusions:** Incidents that do not result in a finding of responsibility, or organizations currently under active investigation, are not listed to protect the integrity of the process and due process rights.
- **Frequency:** This report is updated as outcomes are finalized and shared with the campus community at least twice per year.
