The WAI conference offers attendees numerous opportunities to connect and seek mentorship with aviation industry professionals, take part in an array of educational sessions and professional development seminars where students can choose which session to attend based on their career goals and personal interests, sit in on industry briefings from the various airlines and organizations that our students are considering working for, and hear from inspiring world-class keynote speakers. This event is unmatched in the aviation industry and every single one of our Mt. Sac students in the Aeronautics Department would benefit from this conference.

This event has the ability to motivate and push our students forward in their future careers. For this reason, The WAI conference will enhance student experience by creating co-curricular engagement, leadership development, and civic engagement and advocacy within our Mt. Sac Aeronautics Department community. The WAI conference is a learning experience that complements what we have been learning though our academic curriculum in a concrete way.
