

ACES Program Highlights:

The Achieving in College, Ensuring Success (ACES) TRIO Program was established by the Department of Education at Mt. San Antonio College in 2010. It is one of two TRIO Programs (Upward Bound & ACES Program) at Mt. SAC. ACES assists 150 first generation and/or low-income Mt. SAC students with academic preparation to graduate and transfer to four-year institutions. Students involved in the ACES program attain their associate degrees from Mt. SAC and transfer to universities of their choice. We currently have about 500 ACES Alumni that have graduated and transferred to four-year universities and some that are attaining their master's and doctoral degrees that still keep close contact with ACES. ACES successfully completed their first grant cycle (5-year cycle at \$220,000 a year) in 2010 and due to the continued success and attainment of maximum Prior Experience (PE) points was refunded another ten years (2 five year grants) and is currently in a five-year cycle (Sept 1. 2020- August 31, 2025). We are currently in year 4 of our federal TRIO grant, so it is critical to inform Congress on the successes that this program has attained in its 12 years of service.

Request:

The ACES TRIO Program at Mt. San Antonio College is looking forward for the opportunity to highlight the success of their two TRIO programs and have congressional members hear directly from the students' experiences of the impact that the program has had on their academic endeavors. We are seeking funding in the amount of **\$18,000 for 2 TRIO staff and 6 ACES TRIO students to attend this seminar.** Their goal is to attend the Policy Seminar and meet with members of congress to educate new policy makers on the critical importance of educational opportunity programs and to stress the success of the TRIO programs with veteran representatives.

** Transportation justification: the airport is 15 miles away from the hotel-Funds would be used to get from the airport to the hotel and from the hotel to the meetings that are being held at the offices of the Congressional members.

Rationale for request of funds:

TRIO programs funded through the U.S. Department of Education have consistently proven their effectiveness in alleviating the educational barriers that preclude many first-generation and low-income students from completing a college education. These programs have been consistently under attack by cuts to the federal budget by the previous administration and have many times lacked the necessary congressional support. ACES Program experienced sequestration budget cuts in 2013 and 2014 (totaling an 11% overall budget cut) and had to reduce the number of students served from 140 to 133. In 2017, new leadership emerged in Washington, D.C. and is producing education policy in the White House, U.S. Senate, and U.S. House of Representatives. This is an imperative opportunity to educate our Members of Congress and other federal leaders about the outstanding work we have been doing at Mt. SAC towards college access and success, as well as advance the interests of low-income and first-generation students, adult learners, veterans, and students with disabilities.

Selection of students:

Interested Mt. SAC students will fill out an application to be considered for this exciting opportunity in Washington DC. The application will gather information such as confirmation of paid Mt. SAC student fees, major, grade point average and answering 2 short essay questions sharing why they should be considered in attending. Each application will get screened and eligible students will be invited for an interview to discuss the details. A sample of the application is attached to the request. Mt. SAC ACES students that are selected to attend this experience will be able to directly benefit by learning the following skills:

- 1) How to become TRIO advocates at the local, state, and national levels.
- 2) How to advocates and discuss their academic successes to congressional representatives.
- 3) Learn the 50 years of TRIO history by visiting specific cultural monuments and museums and document a short video that they are able to share with their Mt. SAC peers about this experience. This short video will also be posted on the Mt. SAC ACES website encouraging others to contact congressional representatives.
- Students will have a chance to represent the interests of low-income and firstgeneration\students and veterans, adult learners, and learners with disabilities in the policy arena.
- 5) Witness the success of TRIO programs at the university level by visiting TRiO Programs at local universities (SSS & McNair Programs).

Highlights from 2023 Policy Seminar:

ACES Program has received one-time funding from Associated Students in 2016, 2017, 2018 and 2023 to take six students and two staff members to Washington DC to attend Policy Seminar to gain greater insight of the federal legislative process and to meet with Members of Congress to advocate on behalf of TRIO Programs. Students and staff had the opportunity to attend informational sessions to learn about policy advocacy, specifically for TRIO, visit cultural sites at the National Mall, visit universities and met with congressional representatives to speak about the impact that TRIO (ACES Program) has had on their lives and their communities. ACES Program attended the Council of Education Policy Seminar in Washington, D.C and shared their stories of overcoming challenges and the impact that the TRIO ACES Program had on their academic journeys, our group met with the following Congressional and Senate Members: The Honorable Dianne Feinstein The Honorable Judy Chu (D) District 27
