- A. ICC Advisor, Julia Walker
 - i. Updates
 - 1. Mountie Fresh Day April 10 Call for Volunteers
 - a. Yellow half-sheets about club volunteers were collected; extras were distributed. Julia asked that clubs turn them in as soon as possible as we're still in high need for volunteers. This event can count as an A.S. collaboration so long as at least 5 club members volunteer at least 10 hours cumulatively.

- 2. Blood Drive Mt. SAC vs. Cal Poly April 17, 18, and 19 at 9C Stage
 - a. Clubs are encouraged to have their members volunteer, like above, for A.S. collaboration points for Club of the Year.
- 3. Mountie Mentor Meeting April 12 5pm- 7pm at 9C Stage
 - a. Flyer was posted on the ICC FB page (Mt. SAC Inter-Club Council). Students should look on the FB page for relevant content and should keep up with the postings.
- 4. Culture Fair on April 26
 - a. At the last meeting, Cross-Cultural Senator Taylor Muse invited clubs to participate in this event. Clubs can host a booth to represent a specific festival from a country.  - a. Deadline is April 16th. Whether you served in the recent past ICC history or are currently serving, you can apply. The amount awarded does vary; Michelle and Julia play no role in deciding who wins, the Scholarship Committee does. There are 3 qualifications: (1) must have paid the Student Activities Fee, (2) have made an outstanding contribution to the campus community through involvement in Mt. SAC student clubs, and (3) must confirm that you are a current or past ICC Rep and be verified within the last 3 years. The scholarship can be found by going to Mt.  - a. LEAD
 - i. LEAD is another way for students to hone their leadership skills. If a student completes so many workshops (each is 1.5 hours), they can earn either (or both) a Personal Leadership certificate or an Organizational Leadership certificate. This is a great thing to mention on transfer applications.
 - b. Event Calendars
 - i. This gives a tentatively-complete listing of events that clubs may collaborate with A.S. on to earn A.S. Collab points for Club of the Year. Events in this category are subject to the ICC Chair, email Michelle if you have any questions about which events count (Mravel@student.mtsac.edu).

 - i. This is the ICC Rep's biggest resource in collaborating with other clubs on campus in order to earn Club Collab points towards Club of the Year. Clubs are encouraged to email each other to collaborate using the provided emails.
