


# 2016 LGBTQ Roundtable Discussion MT. SAC Mt. San Antonio College *Evaluation Results*

Hosted by Academic Senate & Student Life Office. Funded by Associated Students

The LGBTQ Roundtable Discussion was a three hour event where faculty, staff, and student voices collaborated to address the needs of LGBTQ+ students on campus. Associate Student announced their support in addressing LGBTQ inclusivity at Mt. SAC. Keynote and Queer & Trans\* Activist, Lysandro Valenzuela, addressed having the right support for academic success in the college setting. Academic Senate updated the group on campus LGBTQ initiatives. An hour and a half discussion followed addressing key student needs for LGBTQ student support and inclusion at Mt. SAC.

**40** Student, staff, faculty, and administrators attended  **31** Surveys were collected

Students were asked to rate the following on a Likert Scale:

**1** Strongly Disagree **2** Disagree **3** Neutral **4** Agree **5** Strongly Agree 

And then asked to provide an explanation for their rating:

**Results**

**I developed a greater understanding of LGBTQ student needs at Mt. SAC**

**97%** Agreed or Strongly Agreed  
*"Student voices were vital, challenging, and creative. Was wonderful to have them and their leadership there. There is so much we can do."*

**I developed a better understanding on the LGBTQ initiatives at Mt. SAC**

**94%** Agreed or Strongly Agreed  
*"Because we have different initiatives on different levels (faculty, students, staff) this event helped bring our ideas together."*

**I am satisfied with the progress with services for LGBTQ students at Mt. SAC**

**65%** Did not agree with this statement

*"I am disappointed at the slow pace of support for LGBTQIPA students, but I am hopeful"*  
*"There is simply not enough"*

*"We need FASTER change, more funding, more support, more involvement-Change is too slow"*

#### Faculty Professionalism

*"I honestly haven't had a bad experience with faculty, however, I still don't feel comfortable talking about my Gay identity."*

#### Identifying allies

*"I wish there was more visibility of LGBTQ awareness. Ally or rainbow stickers on nametags or class syllabus"*

#### Lack of resources

*"I wish there were counselors on campus that specialized on LGBTQ issues or identified at LGBTQ"*
