Mt. San Antonio College TRANSFER FACTS

- Mt. SAC consistently ranks among the top 10 transfer community colleges in the state of California
 - o 5th in the state for transfers to the California State University system (CSU)
 - o 7th in the state for transfers to the University of California (UC)
 - 5th in the state for transfers overall to CSU and UC
- Transfers to Cal Poly Pomona have grown by 36% since 2013-14 to a high of 817 in 2017-18
- 51% of transfers to the CSU are Latinx students, an increase of 6%.
- UC Irvine and UCLA are the two highest UC campuses for transfer students
- Annually, an average of 2,468 students transfer to public and private universities within California and to other states
- A total of 12,341 students have transferred from 2013-14 to 2017-18

Transfer Support Services

- Courses are clearly articulated for transfer acceptance enabling students to enroll in the appropriate courses and complete transfer requirements seamlessly
- Within the last 5 years, 15 additional counselors have been hired; and 2 additional transfer specialists have been hired to provide greater transfer support services
- Annually, several thousand students are served through the Transfer Center, transfer workshops, and the annual transfer conference
- Weekly, university representatives visit the Mt. SAC campus to individually meet with students
- o Over 50 transfer universities participate in the transfer fair
- o Over 200 students participate in university field trips throughout the year
- The TRiO program Summer Science Transfer Program boasts a 99% success rate
- EOPS and equity program students participated in the 2019 College Signing Day at UCLA, featuring First Lady Michelle Obama

Transfer Trends and Concerns

- Transfer acceptances have fluctuated over time as California's budget has impacted both the UC and CSU
 - Some years, CSU and UC do not accept mid-year (Spring or Winter term) transfers
 - Some years, CSU and UC have limited the number of acceptances
- Changes in transfer policies have seen a significant increase in acceptances to Cal Poly Pomona and a decrease in acceptances to Cal State Fullerton
 - CSU prioritizes community college transfers based on geographic proximity, enabling more students to be accepted to Cal Poly Pomona over other CSU campuses
- Transfer Achievement Guarantee (TAG) Agreements have enabled students to be automatically accepted, to eight of the nine UC undergraduate campuses, including UCLA, UCI, and UCR.
- Associate Degrees for Transfer (ADT) have increased and guarantee an acceptance into a campus of the CSU, although not necessarily the student's prioritized choice
- Transfer rates for Latinx, African American, American Indian, and Pacific Islander students are below equity. Concentrated efforts will continue to increase success rates for under-served student populations, including Dream, Foster Youth and other equity student populations.
