

Transfer Report
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Transfer Facts

- Mt. SAC consistently ranks among the top 10 transfer community colleges in the state of California. For Fall 2020 transfer admissions and enrollment rankings:
 - 2nd in the State for transfers to the California State University system (CSU); an improvement from a year ago when we were 3rd in the state for transfers to CSU.
 - Remained in 7th in the State for transfers to the University of California (UC).
 - 4th in the State for transfers overall to CSU and UC; an improvement from a year ago when we were 5th.
- Cal Poly Pomona is the highest CSU campus for transfer students at 958.
- 57% of transfers to the CSU are Latinx students, an increase of 2% from a year ago.
- UCLA (114) and UC Irvine (105) are the two highest UC campuses for transfer students.
- 2,701 students transferred to public and private universities within California and to other states for Fall of 2020.
- In a five-year period, a total of 12,420 students have transferred from 2015-2016 to 2019-2020.

Transfer Support Services

- Courses are clearly articulated for transfer acceptance enabling students to enroll in the appropriate courses and complete transfer requirements seamlessly.
- Within the last three years, the Counseling Department has increased the participation and involvement in the Transfer Center having a larger service base and student support for Transfer students.
- Annually, several thousand students are served through the Transfer Center, transfer workshops, and the annual transfer conference; the increase of an additional Transfer Services Specialist has been a tremendous support.
- Weekly, university representatives visit the Mt. SAC campus to individually meet with students; in 2020 it moved the support to an online/remote environment.
- Successfully moved all services, workshops, and fairs to a virtual environment, increasing the services provided to students.
- Hosted a successful Transfer Bootcamp that helped more than 120 students in the preparation for Fall 2020 admissions.
- Hosted a successful Transfer Awareness Week with workshops, university representatives, and Counselors who provided over 160 students transfer

information and awareness including financial aid, admission requirements, and presentation on CSU/UC campuses.

Transfer Trends and Concerns

- Transfer acceptances have increased due to the pandemic, and admissions criteria were modified to lessen the impact on student transfer admissions to both the UC and CSU.
 - We saw increases in both CSU and UC acceptance of Mt. SAC students, 1,578 and 506 respectively.
- Changes in transfer policies have seen a significant increase in acceptances to Cal Poly Pomona:
 - CSU prioritizes community college transfers based on geographic proximity, enabling more students to be accepted to Cal Poly Pomona over other CSU campuses.
- Transfer Achievement Guarantee (TAG) Agreements enabled students to be automatically accepted to eight of the nine UC undergraduate campuses, including UCLA, UCI, and UCR.
- Associate Degrees for Transfer (ADT) increased and guarantee an acceptance into a campus of the CSU, although not necessarily the student's prioritized choice.
- Transfer rates for Latinx students to CSU increased 6% from 2017-18 to 57% in 2019-2020.
- Transfer rates for Asian students to UC remained the same from 2018-2020 at 47%.
- Transfer rates for African-American/Black students to UC increased 3% from the previous year.
- Acceptance rates for CSU and UC are high, 90% and 71% respectively.

Student Transfer Report November 2021

California State University (CSU) – Fall 2020

- 2,619 applications were submitted; 2,383 students were admitted; 1,578 enrolled
- Acceptance rate = 90% for Fall 2020; 3% increase from Fall 2019
- Actual enrollment rate = 60%; 1% decrease from Fall 2019
- Mt. San Antonio College ranked 2nd among Community Colleges in CSU Transfer Applications, Admissions, and Enrollment
- The Fall 2020 acceptance rate is the highest in the last 10 years
- Of those enrolled, 57% were Latinx/Hispanic; 19% Asian; 9% White; 2% African-American/Black
- Latinx/Hispanic increased by 2% (from 55% to 57%) from the previous year, Fall of 2019
- More females (55%) than males (44%) enrolled in Fall of 2020, a difference of 4% from previous year, Fall of 2019
- Highest campus enrollment was Cal Poly Pomona (958); Cal State Fullerton (193); Cal State Los Angeles (121); Cal State Long Beach (84); Cal State San Bernardino (56); Cal State Dominguez Hills (41)
- Highest campus enrollment was Cal Poly Pomona (958) an increase of 202 students from the previous year, Fall of 2019

University of California (UC) – Fall 2020

- 929 applications were submitted; 710 students were admitted; 506 enrolled
- Acceptance rate = 76%; actual enrollment rate = 71%
- The Fall 2020 acceptance rate increased to 506, the most transfer students to the UC system in 10 years
- Mt. San Antonio College ranked 7th among Community Colleges in UC Transfer Applications, Admissions, and Enrollment
- Of those enrolled, 47% were Asian; 29% Latinx/Hispanic; 9% “International”; 7% White; 3% African-American/Black
- Latinx/Hispanic decreased by 2% (from 31% to 29%) from the previous year, Fall of 2019
- More females (51%) than males (48%) enrolled; slight decrease of 1% from previous year, Fall of 2019
- Highest campus enrollment was UCLA (114); UC Irvine (105); UC Riverside (94); UC San Diego (62); Cal Berkeley (46); UC Santa Barbara (35); UC Davis (30); UC Santa Cruz (19); UC Merced (1)

In-State Private Colleges

- 252 transfers – the lowest total numbers in the past ten (10) years

Out-of-State Colleges

- 365 transfers – an increase from the previous four (4) years
