

director's Note

"In our troubled days, it is good to have something outside our planet, something fine and distant for comfort."

-ANNIE JUMP CANNON

On the first page of the script for *Silent Sky*, playwright Lauren Gunderson includes the above quote from Annie Cannon, a pioneering astronomer, who, despite living through two World Wars, never lost her sense of wonder and awe for the universe. All the women at the center of *Silent Sky*—Henrietta Leavitt, Annie Jump Cannon, and Williamina Fleming—are based on real-life historical women who worked at Harvard Observatory in the early 1900s and faced immense challenges. Some of them were immigrants, some lived with disabilities, and all struggled in a society where they had little voice or power, both in the workplace and their country. Yet, despite these barriers, they made groundbreaking contributions to the field of astronomy that continue to shape our understanding of the universe today.

Silent Sky focuses specifically on the life and work of Henrietta Leavitt, whose discoveries revolutionized our understanding of the cosmos. Before her work, astronomers believed our Milky Way galaxy was the entire universe. It was through Henrietta's meticulous cataloging of stars that we came to understand that our galaxy is only one of billions, and that our Earth occupies a tiny, almost insignificant place in the vastness of space. This realization is humbling, but like Annie Jump Cannon, perhaps we too can find comfort in knowing there is so much more beyond ourselves.

If we can zoom out and gain perspective, the struggles that divide us seem smaller. The fact that we are here at all, on this tiny spinning planet, together at this moment—no matter what you believe—is nothing short of a miracle. And I hope that, like Henrietta, we can embrace this awe and gratitude for our all too brief time on this little Earth, in this immense and ever-expanding universe.
