


Welcome to Fall 2024!


Proof of Tutoring Changes


TSR info is now available on EAB Appointment Summaries

In our move to EAB Navigate, we have eliminated our need for TSRs. Instead, we have created spreadsheets for instructors to keep track of which students have attended Writing Center appointments and/or received asynchronous feedback.

To make it easier for our staff to keep track of, we will utilize Excel spreadsheets through Google Drive. Each instructor will have their own spreadsheet that will be updated 1-2 times per week by our staff. All proof of attendance is now being sent virtually and directly to instructors in this way, including for inperson sessions.

Asynchronous Feedback

This "paper drop-off" service is designed to help Mt. SAC students improve their writing. By choosing this service, students will receive help in recognizing recurrent errors, finding ways to organize ideas, and becoming better at identifying how to improve their own writing! It works best for complete or near complete essay drafts.

Encourage your students, especially in online classes, to submit their work via our Smartsheet Link for asynchronous review by one of our Writing Center specialists!

We will normally deliver feedback via email within 24-48 hours of submission although longer time is possible in high traffic times.

Request a Dedicated Writing Specialist for your writing classes today!

To reflect the changing needs and working habits of today's students, the Writing Center is proud to roll out a new **Embedded Writing Support Program: The Dedicated Writing Specialist Program.** This transition is not merely a new name, but also a shift in focus, as we transition from a classroom-based model to a program better able to address student needs for flexible, multimodal academic support that is able to provide more just-in-time outside the classroom supplemental assistance. This model will allow us to use our limited time and budget to provide more writing and learning support when students need it most – when they are working outside your classroom.

A Dedicated Writing Specialist (DS) is assigned to provide support to specific writing-intensive courses (with priority given to First-year Composition and AMLA 90 sections). DSs lead supplemental group sessions and provide individual outside of class time in addition to assisting with several hours of in-class time every week. They provide a collaborative and interactive learning environment where students can improve their understanding of the course through additional practice and reinforcement of class materials. **Note:** DSs are not guaranteed for all English levels due to budget restrictions.

Online Workshops


Fall workshops start Week 2!

Construction updates...

The Writing Center is being remodeled to better accommodate Mt. SAC students and the academic support professionals and student workers that support them. The Writing Center has not been remodeled in over a decade, and the ways in which students want to engage with us and our space has changed.

Phase one of the remodel began in summer, which means the Writing Center is now operating out of the two back classrooms, 1555 and 1563. The rest of the Writing Center is officially under construction. The tentative time for us to move to phase two, in which we will move back into the front and the two classrooms will undergo remodel, is end of fall 2024. **Our hopeful completion is summer 2025.**

Note: Unfortunately, due to our limited space with the remodel, we can no longer reserve our computer lab for classes.


