

Paid Faculty Professional Development: Working Equitably with Embedded Tutors

The Writing Center is excited to be launching a professional development asynchronous course on equitable practices for faculty working with embedded support in writing intensive courses. This will be a funded opportunity for a selected group of faculty, with the possibility of additional cohorts in the future. The course helps faculty integrate embedded support meaningfully into class activities, using asset-based framing to encourage tutoring participation. This initiative advances student success and retention by strengthening one of our most effective equity-driven support models; when faculty leverage embedded support intentionally, students gain mentoring, clarity, and a stronger sense of belonging, all of which support persistence.
