

Writing Center Online Workshop Descriptions

The Writing Center's FREE 60 minute online workshops are taught by Writing Center instructors. All workshops available to current Mt. SAC students. - ✓ **Adjective Clauses**—This workshop helps writers learn to create complex sentences with adjective clauses to improve clarity and sentence variety. (Designed for English Learners and non-native English speakers.)
- ✓ **Analytical Paragraphs Using the MEAL Plan**—Learn how to write analytical paragraphs based on strategies from the MEAL Plan (Main Idea, Evidence, Analysis, and Link).
- ✓ **Analyzing Literature and Film**—Come learn literary analysis techniques useful for papers about literature and film.
- ✓ **APA Style**—Learn the rules of APA style for citing sources in a research paper.
- ✓ **Article Usage: A, An, The**—This workshop covers the grammatical rules for using *a*, *an*, & *the*. (Designed for English Learners and non-native English speakers.)
- ✓ **Better Brainstorming and Essay Planning Tips**—This workshop covers helpful brainstorming and essay planning techniques.
- ✓ **College Reading Strategies**—Come learn about successful Reading Apprenticeship strategies for college texts.
- ✓ **Complex Sentences with Adverb Clauses**—Students will practice creating complex sentences with adverb clauses using appropriate connectors and punctuation. (Designed for English Learners and non-native English speakers.)
- ✓ **Conquering Commas**—This workshop offers a review of correct comma usage.
- ✓ **Fixing Fragments, Run-ons, and Comma Splices**—Discover easy ways for fixing these common errors.
- ✓ **Gerunds and Infinitives**—This workshop helps writers learn when to use a gerund (verb + ing) or an infinitive (to + verb) verb form. (Designed for English Learners and non-native English speakers.)
- ✓ **Guessing Meaning from Context**—Learn about using context clues to decipher the meaning of unknown words and increase understanding of texts. (Designed for English learners and non-native English speakers. Also appropriate for native English speakers.)
- ✓ **In-class Essay Writing Tips**—Learn and practice strategies for successful in-class writing. (Designed for native and non-native English speakers.)
- ✓ **Mastering MLA 8th Edition**—Learn the rules of MLA format for citing sources in a research paper.
- ✓ **NoodleTools—Citations Made Easy**—Discover the stress-free way to create a bibliography using NoodleTools software. Come learn the easy step-by-step process.
- ✓ **Note-Taking Strategies**—Come learn different note-taking strategies in order to take quick and effective notes on lectures and reading assignments. (Designed for native and non-native English speakers.)
- ✓ **Paragraph Writing Basics for English Language Learners**—This workshop is designed to help English language learners understand the basics of paragraph writing and practice writing well-developed and unified paragraphs.
- ✓ **Parts of Speech and Word Forms**—This workshop is designed to help English learners and non-native English speakers recognize different parts of speech and utilize correct word forms in sentences.
- ✓ **Pronoun Agreement**—Learn how to fix pronoun agreement problems. (Designed for native and non-native English speakers.)
- ✓ **Simple and Compound Sentences**—Students will practice simple sentences and different methods for creating compound sentences using appropriate connectors and punctuation. (Designed for non-native English speakers. Also appropriate for native speakers.)
- ✓ **Steps to a Strong Thesis**—Develop tools for creating strong thesis statements for your essays.
- ✓ **Subject Verb Agreement**—Learn how to fix subject-verb agreement problems. Designed for native and non-native English speakers.
- ✓ **Summary Writing**—Come learn the best techniques for writing summaries. (Designed for native and non-native English speakers.)
- ✓ **Understanding and Avoiding Plagiarism**—Come learn what is considered plagiarism in the U.S. and ways to avoid it. (Designed for native and non-native English speakers.)
- ✓ **Using Quotation and Paraphrases Correctly**—Learn how to correctly integrate quotations and paraphrases into your papers while avoiding plagiarism. This workshop is designed for students writing research papers.
- ✓ **Using WC Tools to Improve and Organize Your Writing**—Explore and navigate the Writing Center and its varied services. You will gather relevant information needed to prepare for a tutoring session, examine what happens during the session, and know how to apply new skills and concepts after your session.
- ✓ **Verbs Boot Camp**—Designed for English learners and non-native English speakers, this is a four-part series on the English verb system. Day 1: Simple Tenses, Day 2: Progressive Tenses, Day 3: Perfect Tenses, and Day 4: Perfect Progressive Tenses. Students who attend all four sessions will receive a certificate.
- ✓ **Writing Boot Camp** - This three-part series workshop is designed to help English learners and non-native English speakers improve foundational writing skills. Day 1: Vocabulary Building Strategies, Day 2: Constructing Clear Body Paragraphs, Day 3: Correcting Common Errors. Students who attend all three sessions will receive a certificate
- ✓ **Writing Your Research Paper**—Learn how to draft, organize, and incorporate sources into your research papers.
